

Browse as a Verb


Definitions of "Browse" as a verb

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "browse" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Look around casually and randomly, without seeking anything in particular.
- Feed as in a meadow or pasture.
- Scan through a text, website, or collection of data to gain an impression of the contents.
- (of an animal) feed on leaves, twigs, or other high-growing vegetation.
- Survey goods for sale in a leisurely and casual way.
- Shop around; not necessarily buying.
