- *Look around casually and randomly, without seeking anything in particular.*
- *Feed as in a meadow or pasture.*
- *Scan through a text, website, or collection of data to gain an impression of the contents.*
- *(of an animal) feed on leaves, twigs, or other high-growing vegetation.*
- *Survey goods for sale in a leisurely and casual way.*
- *Shop around; not necessarily buying.*



- *Eat lightly, try different dishes.*

<b>look around</b>	Accord in appearance with.
<b>look round</b>	Perceive with attention; direct one's gaze towards.
<b>nibble</b>	Eat frequently in small amounts. <i>He <b>nibbled</b> a biscuit.</i>
<b>pasture</b>	Put animals to graze in a pasture. <i>They <b>pastured</b> their cows in the water meadow.</i>
<b>peruse</b>	Examine or consider with attention and in detail. <i>I <b>perused</b> several online reviews.</i>
<b>range</b>	Place or arrange in a row or rows or in a specified manner. <i>The instruments <b>ranged</b> from tuba to cymbals.</i>
<u><b>ruminate</b></u>	(of a ruminant) chew the cud. <i>Cows <b>ruminate</b>.</i>
<b>run one's eye over</b>	Stretch out over a distance, space, time, or scope; run or extend between two points or beyond a certain point.
<u><b>scan</b></u>	(of verse) conform to metrical principles. <i>We <b>scanned</b> the beam over a sector of 120.</i>
<b>shop</b>	Visit one or more shops or websites to buy goods. <i>Sometimes it's more convenient to <b>shop</b> online.</i>
<u><b>skim</b></u>	Remove from the surface. <i>Bring the stock to the boil then <b>skim</b> it to remove any foam.</i>
<b>surf</b>	Ride the waves of the sea with a surfboard. <i><b>Surf</b> the internet or the world wide web.</i>
<b>window-shop</b>	Examine the shop windows; shop with the eyes only.
