- In a vicious manner.

## Synonyms of "Brutally" as an adverb (2 Words)

**savagely** In a fierce, violent, and uncontrolled manner. Civil liberties would be **savagely** affected.

viciously

In a cruel or violent manner.

He was viciously attacked.

- He was imprisoned and brutally tortured.
- Weeks of brutally cold weather.



- A brutally candid interview.
- He brutally murdered an innocent man.

harbarism A brutal barbarous savage act.

The collapse of civilization and the return to **barbarism**.

**barbarous** (of persons or their actions) able or disposed to inflict pain or suffering.

A **barbarous** crime.

bloodthirsty A Line White to kill and maim.

A **bloodthirsty** dictator.

**brutish** Resembling a beast; showing lack of human sensibility.

He was coarse and **brutish**.

Able or disposed to inflict pain or suffering.

**Cruel** tortures.

(of laws or their application) excessively harsh and severe.

**draconian** The Nazis destroyed the independence of the press by a series of **draconian** 

laws.

**ferocious** Very great; extreme. *A ferocious* beast.

The state or quality of being ferocious.

The **ferocity** of the storm caught them by surprise.

Violently agitated and turbulent.

The **fierce** thunders roar me their music.

**gory** Covered with blood. A **gory** horror film.

harsh Disagreeable to the senses.

Drenched in a **harsh** white neon light.

heinous (of a person or wrongful act, especially a crime) utterly odious or wicked.

**Heinous** accusations.

**inhuman** Without compunction or human feeling. Something dark and **inhuman** in form.

inhumane Without compassion for misery or suffering; cruel.

Confining wild horses is **inhumane**.

merciless Showing no mercy.

The merciless enemy.



Known widely and usually unfavorably. notorious

Los Angeles is **notorious** for its smog.

Extremely unpleasant; repulsive. odious

Consequences **odious** to those you govern.

A person who commits parricide. parricide

A person who persecutes someone, especially for their ethnicity, religion, or

sexual orientation or political beliefs. persecutor

He became known as a **persecutor** of dissidents.

(especially of weather) unrelentingly harsh or severe.

pitiless

A night of **pitiless** rain.

(psychiatry) the classical defense mechanism that protects you from impulses

or ideas that would cause anxiety by preventing them from becoming

repression conscious.

His goal was the **repression** of insolence.

Having or showing no pity or compassion for others. ruthless

An act of **ruthless** ferocity.

Deriving pleasure from inflicting pain, suffering, or humiliation on others. sadistic

A **sadistic** killer.

Marked by eagerness to resort to violence and bloodshed. sanguinary

This bitter and **sanguinary** war.

(of something bad or negative) very great; severe. savage

The mother of one of the victims has described his assailants as **savage**s.

truculence Obstreperous and defiant aggressiveness.

Defiantly aggressive.

truculent The **truculent** attitude of farmers to cheaper imports.

Intensely or extremely bad or unpleasant in degree or quality. wicked

A wicked cough.
