Brutally as an Adverb

Definitions of "Brutally" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “brutally” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *In a savagely violent way.*
- *In a direct way that does not attempt to disguise unpleasantness.*
- *To an extremely unpleasant or harsh degree.*
- *In a vicious manner.*

Synonyms of "Brutally" as an adverb (2 Words)

savagely In a fierce, violent, and uncontrolled manner.
*Civil liberties would be **savagely** affected.*

viciously In a cruel or violent manner.
*He was **viciously** attacked.*

- *She was unapologetic and brutally honest.*
- *He was imprisoned and brutally tortured.*
- *Weeks of brutally cold weather.*

- *A brutally candid interview.*

barbarism	A brutal barbarous savage act. <i>The collapse of civilization and the return to barbarism.</i>
barbarous	(of persons or their actions) able or disposed to inflict pain or suffering. A barbarous crime.
bloodthirsty	Having or showing a desire to kill and maim. A bloodthirsty dictator.
brutish	Resembling a beast; showing lack of human sensibility. <i>He was coarse and brutish.</i>
cruel	Able or disposed to inflict pain or suffering. Cruel tortures.
draconian	(of laws or their application) excessively harsh and severe. <i>The Nazis destroyed the independence of the press by a series of draconian laws.</i>
ferocious	Very great; extreme. A ferocious beast.
ferocity	The state or quality of being ferocious. <i>The ferocity of the storm caught them by surprise.</i>
fierce	Violently agitated and turbulent. <i>The fierce thunders roar me their music.</i>
gory	Covered with blood. A gory horror film.
harsh	Disagreeable to the senses. <i>Drenched in a harsh white neon light.</i>
heinous	(of a person or wrongful act, especially a crime) utterly odious or wicked. Heinous accusations.
inhuman	Without compunction or human feeling. <i>Something dark and inhuman in form.</i>
inhumane	Without compassion for misery or suffering; cruel. <i>Confining wild horses is inhumane.</i>
merciless	Showing no mercy. <i>The merciless enemy.</i>

notorious	Known widely and usually unfavorably. <i>Los Angeles is notorious for its smog.</i>
odious	Extremely unpleasant; repulsive. <i>Consequences odious to those you govern.</i>
parricide	A person who commits parricide.
persecutor	A person who persecutes someone, especially for their ethnicity, religion, or sexual orientation or political beliefs. <i>He became known as a persecutor of dissidents.</i>
pitiless	(especially of weather) unrelentingly harsh or severe. <i>A night of pitiless rain.</i>
repression	(psychiatry) the classical defense mechanism that protects you from impulses or ideas that would cause anxiety by preventing them from becoming conscious. <i>His goal was the repression of insolence.</i>
ruthless	Having or showing no pity or compassion for others. <i>An act of ruthless ferocity.</i>
sadistic	Deriving pleasure from inflicting pain, suffering, or humiliation on others. <i>A sadistic killer.</i>
sanguinary	Marked by eagerness to resort to violence and bloodshed. <i>This bitter and sanguinary war.</i>
savage	(of something bad or negative) very great; severe. <i>The mother of one of the victims has described his assailants as savages.</i>
truculence	Obstreperous and defiant aggressiveness.
truculent	Defiantly aggressive. <i>The truculent attitude of farmers to cheaper imports.</i>
wicked	Intensely or extremely bad or unpleasant in degree or quality. <i>A wicked cough.</i>
