- *Expel gas from the stomach.*
- *Form, produce, or emit bubbles.*
- *Flow in an irregular current with a bubbling noise.*
- *Rise in bubbles or as if in bubbles.*



## Synonyms of "Bubbles" as a verb (8 Words)

- babble** Utter something rapidly and incoherently.  
*He **babbled** to another convict while he was in jail.*
- belch** Expel gas from the stomach.  
*A factory chimney **belches** out smoke.*
- burble** Flow in an irregular current with a bubbling noise.  
*He **burbled** on about annuities.*
- burp** Make (a baby) belch after feeding, typically by patting its back.  
*Please don't **burp** at the table.*
- eruct** Emit stomach gas noisily through the mouth; belch.
- guggle** Drink from a flask with a gurgling sound.
- gurgle** Drink from a flask with a gurgling sound.  
*The rain **gurgled** along the gutters.*

**ripple** Stir up water so as to form ripples.  
A cool wind **rippled** the surface of the estuary.



### Usage Examples of "Bubbles" as a verb

- *Bubble gas through a liquid.*
- *Bubble to the surface.*



## Associations of "Bubbles" (30 Words)

- ablution** An act of washing oneself.  
*The women performed their **ablutions**.*
- bath** A soaking and washing in a bathtub.  
*She took a long hot **bath**.*
- bathe** Cleanse the entire body.  
*A **bathe** in the cold North Sea.*
- bathtub** A relatively large open container that you fill with water and use to wash the body.
- borax** A white compound which occurs as a mineral in some alkaline salt deposits and is used in making glass and ceramics, as a metallurgical flux, and as an antiseptic.
- churn** Produce butter by churning milk or cream.  
*The women were **churning** butter and making cheese.*

<b>cleanse</b>	Rid of something unpleasant or defiling. <i>I recommend doing a <b>cleanse</b> when your social calendar is event free because you might feel a bit more tired than usual.</i>
<b>conditioner</b>	A trainer of athletes. <i>Farm work can be a good <b>conditioner</b>.</i>
<b>dampen</b>	Make moist. <i>Slider switches on the mixers can <b>dampen</b> the drums.</i>
<b>drizzle</b>	(in cooking) a thin stream of a liquid ingredient trickled over food. <i>Scotland will be cloudy with patchy <b>drizzle</b>.</i>
<b>effervescence</b>	Vivacity and enthusiasm. <i>The <b>effervescence</b> of sparkling wine.</i>
<b>excite</b>	Cause to be agitated excited or roused. <i><b>Excite</b> the audience.</i>
<b>fizz</b>	The quality of being fizzy effervescence. <i>The champagne had lost its <b>fizz</b>.</i>
<b>froth</b>	Make froth or foam and become bubbly. <i>The angry man was <b>frothing</b> at the mouth.</i>
<b>frothy</b>	Emitting or filled with bubbles as from carbonation or fermentation. <i>Steaming mugs of <b>frothy</b> coffee.</i>
<b>lather</b>	Form or cause to form a lather. <i>She rinsed off the <b>lather</b> and dried her hands.</i>
<b>launder</b>	Conceal the origins of (money obtained illegally), typically by transfers involving foreign banks or legitimate businesses. <i>We began to notice attempts to <b>launder</b> the data retrospectively.</i>
<b>lave</b>	Wash or flow against. <i>The sea below <b>laved</b> the shore with small agitated waves.</i>
<b>moisten</b>	Moisten with fine drops. <i>The dew <b>moistened</b> the meadows.</i>
<b>oxygenation</b>	The process of providing or combining or treating with oxygen. <i>The <b>oxygenation</b> of the blood.</i>
<b>plumbing</b>	The work of installing and maintaining a plumbing system. <i>The kitchen has a gas cooker point and <b>plumbing</b> for an automatic washing machine.</i>
<b>restroom</b>	A room in a public building for people to relax or recover in.
<b>rinse</b>	Rinse one's mouth and throat with mouthwash. <i>The medication is used as a <b>rinse</b> twice a day after breakfast and dinner.</i>



- shampoo** An act of washing or cleaning something especially the hair with shampoo.  
*The foyer smelled of dusty plants and carpet **shampoo**.*
- shiny** Having a shiny surface or coating.  
*Saw the moon like a **shiny** dime on a deep blue velvet carpet.*
- shower** Of a mass of small things fall or be thrown in a shower.  
*You should **shower** after vigorous exercise.*
- soap** Wash with soap.  
*She **soaped** her face.*
- toilet** Assist or supervise someone especially an infant or invalid in using a toilet.  
*Most patients with the disease are incontinent although this may be minimized with regular **toileting**.*
- tub** The amount that a tub will hold.  
*She s revolting she doesn t **tub**.*
- wash** A quantity of clothes needing to be or just having been washed.  
*Floods **washed** away the bridges.*
