Synonyms of "Bubbly" as an adjective (24 Words)

aerated	(of a liquid) made effervescent by being charged with carbon dioxide or some other gas. <i>Aerated spring water.</i>
animated	Made to appear to move as living creatures do. <i>An animated version of the classic fairy tale.</i>
bubbling	Containing bubbles or making a bubbling sound. <i>A bubbling cocktail party.</i>
carbonated	Having carbonation especially artificially carbonated.
dynamic	Of or relating to dynamics. <i>A dynamic economy.</i>
<u>ebullient</u>	Joyously unrestrained. <i>Misted and ebullient seas.</i>
<u>effervescent</u>	(of a liquid) giving off bubbles. <i>Effervescent young people.</i>

effervescing	Emitting or filled with bubbles as from carbonation or fermentation.
<u>energetic</u>	Possessing or exerting or displaying energy. <i>An energetic fund raiser for the college.</i>
fizzy	Full of energy or exuberance; lively. <i>Fizzy mineral water.</i>
foaming	Producing a mass of small bubbles; frothing. <i>Pints of foaming bitter.</i>
foamy	Producing or covered with lathery sweat or saliva from exhaustion or disease. <i>Foamy or frothy beer.</i>
frothy	Full of or covered with a mass of small bubbles. <i>Lots of frothy interviews.</i>
full of life	Having ample fabric.
gassy	Resembling gas. <i>A long and gassy book.</i>
high-spirited	Joyously unrestrained.
lively	Filled with events or activity. <i>Lively and attractive parents.</i>
scintillating	Brilliantly and excitingly clever or skilful. <i>Scintillating wit.</i>
<u>sparkling</u>	(of a drink) effervescent; fizzy. <i>Sparkling wine.</i>
<u>spirited</u>	Made lively or spirited. <i>A spirited campaigner for women s rights.</i>
spummy	Emitting or filled with bubbles as from carbonation or fermentation.
<u>vibrant</u>	Quivering; pulsating. <i>Rose was vibrant with anger.</i>
<u>vivacious</u>	Attractively lively and animated (typically used of a woman). <i>A charming and vivacious hostess.</i>
zestful	Characterized by great enthusiasm and energy. <i>A zestful and exuberant player.</i>

Associations of "Bubbly" (30 Words)

ablution	A ceremonial act of washing parts of the body or sacred containers. <i>The women performed their ablutions.</i>
bath	A room as in a residence containing a bathtub or shower and usually a washbasin and toilet. <i>How to bath a baby.</i>
<u>bathe</u>	Wash (someone) in a bath. <i>Bathe daily.</i>
bathtub	A relatively large open container that you fill with water and use to wash the body.

borax	A white compound which occurs as a mineral in some alkaline salt deposits and is used in making glass and ceramics, as a metallurgical flux, and as an antiseptic.
churn	Produce butter by churning milk or cream. <i>You never feel rested because your mind is always churning.</i>
cleanse	Rid of something unpleasant or defiling. <i>The mission to cleanse the nation of subversives.</i>
conditioner	Exercise that conditions the body. <i>Farm work can be a good conditioner.</i>
dampen	Lessen in force or effect. <i>The fine rain dampened her face.</i>
drizzle	Very light rain; stronger than mist but less than a shower. <i>Scotland will be cloudy with patchy drizzle.</i>
effervescence	Bubbles in a liquid; fizz. <i>The effervescence of sparkling wine.</i>
excite	Cause to be agitated excited or roused. <i>Flying still excites me.</i>
fizz	The quality of being fizzy effervescence. <i>A glass of your favourite fizz.</i>
froth	Become bubbly or frothy or foaming. <i>Users found it easy to froth milk for cappuccino.</i>
frothy	Emitting or filled with bubbles as from carbonation or fermentation. <i>Steaming mugs of frothy coffee.</i>
lather	Form or cause to form a lather. <i>The shaving cream lathered.</i>
launder	Cleanse with a cleaning agent, such as soap, and water. <i>123 000 had been laundered through Geneva bank accounts.</i>
lave	Cleanse (one's body) with soap and water. <i>The sea below laved the shore with small agitated waves.</i>
moisten	Moisten with fine drops. <i>The dew moistened the meadows.</i>
oxygenation	The process of providing or combining or treating with oxygen. <i>The oxygenation of the blood.</i>
plumbing	The work of installing and maintaining a plumbing system. <i>The kitchen has a gas cooker point and plumbing for an automatic washing machine.</i>
restroom	A room in a public building for people to relax or recover in.

rinse	Rinse one's mouth and throat with mouthwash. <i>The medication is used as a rinse twice a day after breakfast and dinner.</i>
shampoo	An act of washing or cleaning something especially the hair with shampoo. <i>The foyer smelled of dusty plants and carpet shampoo.</i>
<u>shiny</u>	Having a shiny surface or coating. <i>Shiny black patents.</i>
shower	A sudden downpour as of tears or sparks etc likened to a rain shower. <i>His hooves showered sparks across the concrete floor.</i>
soap	Wash with soap. <i>The soaps are top of the ratings.</i>
toilet	A room or building equipped with one or more toilets. <i>Liz heard the toilet flush.</i>
tub	A washtub. <i>The old tub s in need of a refit.</i>
<u>wash</u>	Be capable of being washed. <i>The walls were covered with a pale lemon wash.</i>
