<b>brick</b>	Throw bricks at. <i>Installing an unofficial OS voids the warranty and may <b>brick</b> the phone.</i>

<a href="#">concoct</a>	Make a concoction of by mixing. <i>His cronies <b>concocted</b> a simple plan.</i>
<a href="#">concrete</a>	Cover an area with concrete. <i>The precious English countryside may soon be <b>concreted</b> over.</i>
<b>construct</b>	Make by combining materials and parts. <i>Poetics should <b>construct</b> a theory of literary discourse.</i>
<b>create</b>	Create by artistic means. <i>Over 170 jobs were <b>created</b>.</i>
<b>delicatessen</b>	A shop selling ready-to-eat food products.
<b>edifice</b>	A structure that has a roof and walls and stands more or less permanently in one place. <i>The concepts on which the <b>edifice</b> of capitalism was built.</i>
<b>establish</b>	Build or establish something abstract. <i>The two countries <b>established</b> diplomatic relations in 1992.</i>
<b>fabricate</b>	Make up something artificial or untrue. <i>You will have to <b>fabricate</b> an exhaust system.</i>
<b>fancied</b>	Formed or conceived by the imagination. <i>A <b>fancied</b> wrong.</i>

<b>floor</b>	The occupants of a floor. <i>The ocean <b>floor</b>.</i>
<b>forge</b>	A workplace where metal is worked by heating and hammering. <i>He <b>forged</b> ahead.</i>
<b>formulate</b>	Prepare according to a formula. <i>Use special effects paints that are <b>formulated</b> for the task.</i>
<b>found</b>	Set up or found. <i>Collages of <b>found</b> photos.</i>
<b>foundation</b>	An institution established with an endowment, for example a research body or charity. <i>Build the arch resting on top of this solid <b>foundation</b>.</i>
<b>institute</b>	An association organized to promote art or science or education. <i>The award was <b>instituted</b> in 1900.</i>
<b>invent</b>	Come up with (an idea, plan, explanation, theory, or principle) after a mental effort. <i>He <b>invented</b> an improved form of the steam engine.</i>
<b>kiln</b>	A furnace for firing or burning or drying such things as porcelain or bricks.
<b>make</b>	Make by shaping or bringing together constituents. <i><b>Make</b> enemies.</i>
<b>manufacture</b>	Manufactured articles. <i>The porcelain <b>manufacture</b> for which France became justly renowned.</i>
<b>muralist</b>	A painter of murals.
<b>parapet</b>	A low wall along the edge of a roof or balcony. <i>The sandbags that made up the <b>parapet</b> had been blown away and the wall of the trench had caved in.</i>
<b>reclaim</b>	The action or process of reclaiming or being reclaimed. <i>A sufficient weight of plastic could easily be <b>reclaimed</b>.</i>
<b>roof</b>	Provide a building with a roof cover a building with a roof. <i>They slept under the same <b>roof</b>.</i>
<b>ruse</b>	An action intended to deceive someone; a trick. <i>Emma tried to think of a <b>ruse</b> to get Paul out of the house.</i>
<b>thatch</b>	Cover with thatch. <i>They have constructed the walls and are now <b>thatching</b> the roof.</i>
<b>tile</b>	Cover with tiles. <i><b>Tile</b> the wall and the floor of the bathroom.</i>
