<u>bar</u>	The crossbar of a goal. Journalists had been <b>bar</b> red from covering the elections.
barricade	Block off with barricades. <i>Barricade</i> the streets.
barrier	A circumstance or obstacle that keeps people or things apart or prevents communication or progress. The mountain <b>barrier</b> between Norway and Sweden.
<u>closure</u>	Apply the closure to a debate or speaker in a legislative assembly. <i>He brings modernistic <b>closure</b> to his narrative.</i>
construction	The industry of constructing buildings, roads, etc. 50 000 more jobs will go from <b>construction</b> .
contraband	Goods that have been imported or exported illegally. <i>Contraband brandy.</i>
cube	Cut food into small cubes. I bought sirloin from the butcher and <b>cube</b> d it myself.
cubic	A cubic equation or a curve described by one. A <b>cubic</b> room.
dice	A game played with dice. <i>His side continue to <b>dice</b> with disaster.</i>
difficulty	The quality of being difficult. There is a practical <b>difficulty</b> .
<u>disallow</u>	Command against. He was offside and the goal was <b>disallow</b> ed.
<u>discouraged</u>	Having lost confidence or enthusiasm; disheartened. The accident left others <b>discouraged</b> about going there.
<u>fence</u>	Surround or protect with a fence. Walkers may find themselves <b>fence</b> d out of the moor.



<u>forbid</u>	(of a circumstance or quality) make (something) impossible; prevent. <i>All vehicles are <b>forbid</b>den.</i>
interdict	A court order prohibiting a party from doing a certain activity. I have not been <b>interdict</b> ed from consuming alcoholic beverages.
interdiction	A court order prohibiting a party from doing a certain activity. <i>The interdiction</i> of the slave trade.
lattice	An interlaced structure or pattern resembling a lattice. <i>The lattice</i> of branches above her.
levee	A ridge of sediment deposited naturally alongside a river by overflowing water.
<u>pessimistic</u>	Tending to see the worst aspect of things or believe that the worst will happen. <i>He was pessimistic about the prospects.</i>
<u>prohibit</u>	Formally forbid (something) by law, rule, or other authority. <i>He is <b>prohibit</b>ed from becoming a director.</i>
prohibitionist	A reformer who opposes the use of intoxicating beverages.
prohibitory	Tending to discourage (especially of prices.
proscribe	Denounce or condemn. A plaque on which were the names of <b>proscribe</b> d traitors.
rampart	Fortify or surround with or as if with a rampart. A castle with <b>rampart</b> s and a moat.
<u>scaffold</u>	Provide with a scaffold for support. <i>Scaffold</i> the building before painting it.
<u>square</u>	Denoting the length of each side of a square shape or object. A <b>square</b> deal.
<u>stance</u>	A site on a street for a market, street vendor's stall, or taxi rank. She altered her <b>stance</b> resting all her weight on one leg.
stanch	Stop the flow of a liquid.
<u>wall</u>	Anything that suggests a wall in structure or function or effect. <i>A garden wall</i> .
