bar	The crossbar of a goal. <i>Journalists had been barred from covering the elections.</i>
barricade	Block off with barricades. <i>Barricade the streets.</i>
barrier	A circumstance or obstacle that keeps people or things apart or prevents communication or progress. <i>The mountain barrier between Norway and Sweden.</i>
closure	Apply the closure to a debate or speaker in a legislative assembly. <i>He brings modernistic closure to his narrative.</i>
construction	The industry of constructing buildings, roads, etc. <i>50 000 more jobs will go from construction.</i>
contraband	Goods that have been imported or exported illegally. <i>Contraband brandy.</i>
cube	Cut food into small cubes. <i>I bought sirloin from the butcher and cubed it myself.</i>
cubic	A cubic equation or a curve described by one. <i>A cubic room.</i>
dice	A game played with dice. <i>His side continue to dice with disaster.</i>
difficulty	The quality of being difficult. <i>There is a practical difficulty.</i>
disallow	Command against. <i>He was offside and the goal was disallowed.</i>
discouraged	Having lost confidence or enthusiasm; disheartened. <i>The accident left others discouraged about going there.</i>
fence	Surround or protect with a fence. <i>Walkers may find themselves fenced out of the moor.</i>

<u>forbid</u>	(of a circumstance or quality) make (something) impossible; prevent. <i>All vehicles are forbidden.</i>
interdict	A court order prohibiting a party from doing a certain activity. <i>I have not been interdicted from consuming alcoholic beverages.</i>
interdiction	A court order prohibiting a party from doing a certain activity. <i>The interdiction of the slave trade.</i>
lattice	An interlaced structure or pattern resembling a lattice. <i>The lattice of branches above her.</i>
levee	A ridge of sediment deposited naturally alongside a river by overflowing water.
<u>pessimistic</u>	Tending to see the worst aspect of things or believe that the worst will happen. <i>He was pessimistic about the prospects.</i>
<u>prohibit</u>	Formally forbid (something) by law, rule, or other authority. <i>He is prohibited from becoming a director.</i>
prohibitionist	A reformer who opposes the use of intoxicating beverages.
prohibitory	Tending to discourage (especially of prices).
proscribe	Denounce or condemn. <i>A plaque on which were the names of proscribed traitors.</i>
rampart	Fortify or surround with or as if with a rampart. <i>A castle with ramparts and a moat.</i>
<u>scaffold</u>	Provide with a scaffold for support. <i>Scaffold the building before painting it.</i>
<u>square</u>	Denoting the length of each side of a square shape or object. <i>A square deal.</i>
<u>stance</u>	A site on a street for a market, street vendor's stall, or taxi rank. <i>She altered her stance resting all her weight on one leg.</i>
stanch	Stop the flow of a liquid.
<u>wall</u>	Anything that suggests a wall in structure or function or effect. <i>A garden wall.</i>
