Definitions of "Buildings" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “buildings” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The commercial activity involved in repairing old structures or constructing new ones.*
- *The act of constructing something.*
- *A structure that has a roof and walls and stands more or less permanently in one place.*
- *The occupants of a building.*



Synonyms of "Buildings" as a noun (2 Words)

construction The action of building something, typically a large structure.
*Sentence **construction**.*

edifice A complex system of beliefs.
*It was an imposing **edifice**.*



Usage Examples of "Buildings" as a noun

- *The entire building complained about the noise.*
- *Workers in the building trades.*
- *There was a three-story building on the corner.*
- *His hobby was the building of boats.*



Associations of "Buildings" (30 Words)

apartment

A suite of rooms usually on one floor of an apartment house.

*The family lived in a rented **apartment**.*

arch

Architecture a masonry construction usually curved for spanning an opening and supporting the weight above it.

*They built a triumphal **arch** to memorialize their victory.*

architecture

The conceptual structure and logical organization of a computer or computer-based system.

*The **architecture** of a computer's system software.*

brick

Block or enclose with a wall of bricks.

*You are really a **brick** Vi Gloria said.*

cabinet

Persons appointed by a head of state to head executive departments of government and act as official advisers.

*A cocktail **cabinet**.*

condominium	The system of ownership by which condominiums operate in which owners have full title to the individual apartment or house and an undivided interest in the shared parts of the property. <i>Sudan was from 1899 an Anglo Egyptian condominium.</i>
construct	An abstract or general idea inferred or derived from specific instances. <i>History is largely an ideological construct.</i>
construction	A building or other structure. <i>The mill is of brick construction.</i>
<u>corner</u>	Turn a corner. <i>The huge bookshop on the corner.</i>
dome	A thing shaped like a dome. <i>The dome of the sky.</i>
edifice	A structure that has a roof and walls and stands more or less permanently in one place. <i>The concepts on which the edifice of capitalism was built.</i>
<u>facade</u>	The face or front of a building. <i>Her flawless public facade masked private despair.</i>
ferroconcrete	Concrete reinforced with steel. <i>A ferroconcrete storage tank.</i>
locus	The effective or perceived location of something abstract. <i>The locus of points equidistant from a given point is a circle.</i>
outdoor	Pertaining to or concerning the outdoors or outdoor activities. <i>A beautiful outdoor setting for the wedding.</i>
<u>rebuild</u>	An instance of rebuilding. <i>The house was rebuild after it was hit by a bomb.</i>
reconstitute	Restore (dried food or drink) to its original state by adding water. <i>The governing board was reconstituted.</i>
<u>reconstruct</u>	Do over, as of (part of) a house. <i>From copies of correspondence it is possible to reconstruct the broad sequence of events.</i>
<u>reconstruction</u>	An impression, model, or re-enactment of a past event formed from the available evidence. <i>Comparison between the original and the reconstruction.</i>
reforestation	The restoration (replanting) of a forest that had been reduced by fire or cutting. <i>The need for post fire reforestation.</i>
<u>reinstate</u>	Restore (someone or something) to their former position or state. <i>The union threatened strike action if Owen was not reinstated.</i>

remodel	Do over, as of (part of) a house. <i>She remodelled the head with careful fingers.</i>
rental	The action of renting something. <i>Several young people sharing a summer rental.</i>
reshuffle	Shuffle (playing cards) again. <i>The new Prime Minister reshuffled his cabinet.</i>
rotunda	A building having a circular plan and a dome. <i>A rotunda that exits on four roads into Greater Manila.</i>
skyscraper	A triangular skysail.
<u>spatial</u>	Pertaining to or involving or having the nature of space. <i>Spatial ability.</i>
stairway	A way of access (upward and downward) consisting of a set of steps. <i>A narrow stone stairway.</i>
<u>tenement</u>	Any kind of permanent property, e.g. lands or rents, held from a superior.
upstairs	Situated on an upper floor. <i>I tiptoed upstairs.</i>
