### **Definitions of "Built" as an adjective**

- *(used of soaps or cleaning agents) having a substance (an abrasive or filler) added to increase effectiveness.*
- *(of a person) having a specified physical size or build.*



## Synonyms of "Built" as an adjective (1 Word)

(used of soaps or cleaning agents) having a substance (an abrasive or filler) **reinforced** added to increase effectiveness.

**Reinforced** concrete contains steel bars or metal netting.

<b>adobe</b>	A building constructed from adobe clay or bricks. <i>Adobe houses.</i>
<b>based</b>	Having a base of operations (often used as a combining form). <i>Carrier <b>based</b> planes.</i>
<b>brick</b>	Bricks collectively as a building material. <i>A large <b>brick</b> building.</i>
<b><u>cement</u></b>	Make fast as if with cement. <i>Dental <b>cement</b>.</i>
<b><u>concoct</u></b>	Make a concoction of by mixing. <i>His cronies <b>concocted</b> a simple plan.</i>
<b><u>concrete</u></b>	Fix in position with concrete. <i>The precious English countryside may soon be <b>concreted</b> over.</i>
<b>construct</b>	Draw with suitable instruments and under specified conditions. <i>Construct a paragraph.</i>

<b>create</b>	Create by artistic means. <i><b>Create</b> a poem.</i>
<b>delicatessen</b>	A shop selling ready-to-eat food products.
<b>edifice</b>	A large, imposing building. <i>The concepts on which the <b>edifice</b> of capitalism was built.</i>
<b>establish</b>	Establish the validity of something as by an example explanation or experiment. <i>The principle of the supremacy of national parliaments needs to be firmly <b>established</b>.</i>
<b>fabricate</b>	Construct or manufacture (an industrial product), especially from prepared components. <i>Officers <b>fabricated</b> evidence.</i>
<b>fancied</b>	Formed or conceived by the imagination. <i>A <b>fancied</b> wrong.</i>
<b>floor</b>	Provide a room or area with a floor. <i>The best way to play is to pass the ball on the <b>floor</b>.</i>
<b>forge</b>	Make or shape (a metal object) by heating it in a fire or furnace and hammering it. <i>He <b>forged</b> ahead.</i>
<b>formulate</b>	Create or prepare methodically. <i>The government has <b>formulated</b> a policy on waste management.</i>
<b>found</b>	Of art comprising or making use of found objects. <i>The lost and <b>found</b> department.</i>
<b>foundation</b>	An institution established with an endowment, for example a research body or charity. <i>Heavy <b>foundations</b> and concealers can contribute to dull skin and clogged pores.</i>
<b>institute</b>	Advance or set forth in court. <i>The award was <b>instituted</b> in 1900.</i>
<b>invent</b>	Concoct something artificial or untrue. <i>He <b>invented</b> an improved form of the steam engine.</i>
<b>kiln</b>	A furnace or oven for burning, baking, or drying, especially one for calcining lime or firing pottery.
<b>make</b>	Make by shaping or bringing together constituents. <i>Can you <b>make</b> me an omelette.</i>
<b>manufacture</b>	Manufactured articles. <i>Firms who <b>manufacture</b> ball bearings.</i>

<b>muralist</b>	A painter of murals.
<b>parapet</b>	A low wall along the edge of a roof or balcony. <i>Mr Scargill raised his head above the <b>parapet</b> to call for the repeal of anti union legislation.</i>
<b>reclaim</b>	The action or process of reclaiming or being reclaimed. <i>You can <b>reclaim</b> 25 of the 435 deducted.</i>
<b>roof</b>	Function as the roof of. <i>The yard had been roughly <b>roofed</b> over with corrugated iron.</i>
<b>ruse</b>	An action intended to deceive someone; a trick. <i>Emma tried to think of a <b>ruse</b> to get Paul out of the house.</i>
<b>thatch</b>	Hair resembling thatched roofing material. <i>A young man with a <b>thatch</b> of untidy blond hair.</i>
<b>tile</b>	Cover with tiles. <i>The lobby was <b>tiled</b> in blue.</i>
