Definitions of "Built" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “built” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(used of soaps or cleaning agents) having a substance (an abrasive or filler) added to increase effectiveness.*
- *(of a person) having a specified physical size or build.*



Synonyms of "Built" as an adjective (1 Word)

(used of soaps or cleaning agents) having a substance (an abrasive or filler) **reinforced** added to increase effectiveness.

Reinforced concrete contains steel bars or metal netting.

- *A slightly built woman.*

adobe	A building constructed from adobe clay or bricks. <i>Adobe houses.</i>
based	Having a base of operations (often used as a combining form). <i>Carrier based planes.</i>
brick	Bricks collectively as a building material. <i>A large brick building.</i>
<u>cement</u>	Make fast as if with cement. <i>Dental cement.</i>
<u>concoct</u>	Make a concoction of by mixing. <i>His cronies concocted a simple plan.</i>
<u>concrete</u>	Fix in position with concrete. <i>The precious English countryside may soon be concreted over.</i>
construct	Draw with suitable instruments and under specified conditions. <i>Construct a paragraph.</i>

create	Create by artistic means. <i>Create a poem.</i>
delicatessen	A shop selling ready-to-eat food products.
edifice	A large, imposing building. <i>The concepts on which the edifice of capitalism was built.</i>
establish	Establish the validity of something as by an example explanation or experiment. <i>The principle of the supremacy of national parliaments needs to be firmly established.</i>
fabricate	Construct or manufacture (an industrial product), especially from prepared components. <i>Officers fabricated evidence.</i>
fancied	Formed or conceived by the imagination. <i>A fancied wrong.</i>
floor	Provide a room or area with a floor. <i>The best way to play is to pass the ball on the floor.</i>
forge	Make or shape (a metal object) by heating it in a fire or furnace and hammering it. <i>He forged ahead.</i>
formulate	Create or prepare methodically. <i>The government has formulated a policy on waste management.</i>
found	Of art comprising or making use of found objects. <i>The lost and found department.</i>
foundation	An institution established with an endowment, for example a research body or charity. <i>Heavy foundations and concealers can contribute to dull skin and clogged pores.</i>
institute	Advance or set forth in court. <i>The award was instituted in 1900.</i>
invent	Concoct something artificial or untrue. <i>He invented an improved form of the steam engine.</i>
kiln	A furnace or oven for burning, baking, or drying, especially one for calcining lime or firing pottery.
make	Make by shaping or bringing together constituents. <i>Can you make me an omelette.</i>
manufacture	Manufactured articles. <i>Firms who manufacture ball bearings.</i>

- parapet** A low wall along the edge of a roof or balcony.

- reclaim** The action or process of reclaiming or being reclaimed.

- roof** Function as the roof of.
*The yard had been roughly **roofed** over with corrugated iron.*
- ruse** An action intended to deceive someone; a trick.
*Emma tried to think of a **ruse** to get Paul out of the house.*
- thatch** Hair resembling thatched roofing material.
*A young man with a **thatch** of untidy blond hair.*
- tile** Cover with tiles.
*The lobby was **tiled** in blue.*
