

- A regular newsletter or report issued by an organization.





## Synonyms of "Bulletin" as a noun (28 Words)


account	The department of a company that deals with financial accounts. They send me an <b>account</b> ing every month.
announcement	The action of making an announcement. The government made an <b>announcement</b> about changes in the drug war.
communication	Something that is communicated by or to or between people or groups. <i>A city providing excellent road and rail communications.</i>
communiqué	An official report (usually sent in haste.
<u>digest</u>	A substance or mixture obtained by digestion. A <b>digest</b> of cloned DNA.
<u>dispatch</u>	The act of sending off something. The situation might change so he should proceed with <b>dispatch</b> .
flash	A newsflash. If I had the chance I d do it in a <b>flash</b> .



gazette	A journal or newspaper. An announcement in Tuesday's London <b>Gazette</b> will make clear that he is being stripped of the honour.
headlines	The heading or caption of a newspaper article.
<u>journal</u>	A record of the daily proceedings in the Houses of Parliament. <i>Medical <b>journal</b>s.</i>
magazine	A business firm that publishes magazines. You can program only the playback sequence of the discs in the <b>magazine</b> not individual tracks.
message	Things bought on an errand; shopping. Select an option to delete your mail <b>message</b> s.
news	The quality of being sufficiently interesting to be reported in news bulletins. The <b>news</b> of my death was greatly exaggerated.
news report	The quality of being sufficiently interesting to be reported in news bulletins.
newscast	A radio or television broadcast of news reports.
newsflash	A short news announcement concerning some on-going news story.
newsletter	Report or open letter giving informal or confidential news of interest to a special group.
newspaper	The physical object that is the product of a newspaper publisher. <i>He read his <b>newspaper</b> at breakfast.</i>
notification	The action of notifying someone or something. We have yet to receive formal <b>notification</b> of the announcement.
periodical	A publication that appears at fixed intervals.
piece	A portable gun. He needed a <b>piece</b> of granite.
press release	A machine used for printing.
proceedings	A published report of a set of meetings or a conference. Criminal <b>proceedings</b> were brought against him.
report	An employee who reports to another employee. <b>Report</b> s were circulating that the chairman was about to resign.
review	A formal or official examination. His case comes up for <b>review</b> in January.
statement	A nonverbal message. She made a <b>statement</b> to the police.

## Associations of "Bulletin" (30 Words)

<u>acquaint</u>	Make someone aware of or familiar with. Permit me to <b>acquaint</b> you with my son.
broadcast	Broadcast over the airwaves as in radio or television. We don t want to <b>broadcast</b> our unhappiness to the world.
broadcasting	The transmission of programmes or information by radio or television. <i>The state monopoly on <b>broadcasting</b></i> .
commentary	A set of explanatory or critical notes on a text. A live <b>commentary</b> on radio.



communication	Social contact. A telephone <b>communication</b> .
consignee	The person to whom merchandise is delivered over.
<u>convey</u>	Make (an idea, impression, or feeling) known or understandable. No application for registration is required when the property is <b>convey</b> ed following a court order.
email	Send an email to someone. Reading <b>email</b> has become the first task of the morning.
informing	To furnish incriminating evidence to an officer of the law (usually in return for favors.
journalism	The product of the activity of journalism. A collection of <b>journalism</b> .
letter	Set down or print with letters. Your personality matters far more than <b>letter</b> s after your name.
letterhead	A sheet of stationery with name and address of the organization printed at the top. Write to the company s registered office which you can normally get from their <b>letterhead</b> .
mail	Send someone email. I ll <b>mail</b> you the check tomorrow.
mailbox	A public box with a slot into which mail is placed for collection by the post office; a postbox.
mailing	The action or process of sending something by mail. <i>The postmark indicates the time of mailing</i> .
message	Send as a message. She <b>message</b> d the committee.
notify	Give notice of or report (something) formally or officially. You will be notified of our decision as soon as possible.
philatelist	A collector and student of postage stamps.
philately	The collection and study of postage stamps.
post	Publicize with or as if with a poster. <b>Post</b> a warning.
<u>receiver</u>	A piece of radio or television apparatus that detects broadcast signals and converts them into visible or audible form. <i>He picked up the <b>receiver</b></i> .
recipient	A person or thing that receives or is awarded something. A <b>recipient</b> country.



report	An employee who reports to another employee. <i>He heard</i> <b>report</b> s that they were causing trouble.
send	Send a message or letter. <b>Send</b> your document as a PDF attachment.
sender	Set used to broadcast radio or tv signals. <b>Sender</b> s of unwanted emails.
spam	A canned meat made largely from pork. An autogenerated <b>spam</b> website.
stamp	Affix a stamp to. His style <b>stamp</b> s him as a player to watch.
<u>telegraph</u>	A device for transmitting messages by telegraph. She would rush off to <b>telegraph</b> news to her magazine.
tidings	News; information. The bearer of glad <b>tidings</b> .
<u>transmit</u>	Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission. Knowledge is <b>transmit</b> ted from teacher to pupil.
