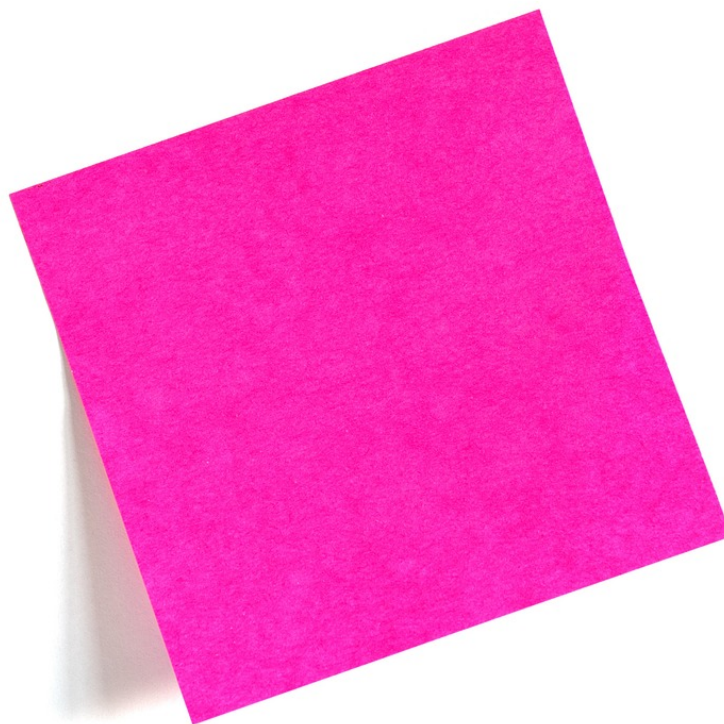

- *A brief report (especially an official statement issued for immediate publication or broadcast.*
- *A short official statement or broadcast summary of news.*
- *A regular newsletter or report issued by an organization.*

account	The department of a company that deals with financial accounts. <i>They send me an accounting every month.</i>
	The action of making an announcement.
announcement	<i>The government made an announcement about changes in the drug war.</i>
communication	Something that is communicated by or to or between people or groups. <i>A city providing excellent road and rail communications.</i>
communiqué	An official report (usually sent in haste).
<u>digest</u>	A substance or mixture obtained by digestion. <i>A digest of cloned DNA.</i>
<u>dispatch</u>	The act of sending off something. <i>The situation might change so he should proceed with dispatch.</i>
flash	A newflash. <i>If I had the chance I d do it in a flash.</i>

gazette	A journal or newspaper. <i>An announcement in Tuesday's London Gazette will make clear that he is being stripped of the honour.</i>
headlines	The heading or caption of a newspaper article.
journal	A record of the daily proceedings in the Houses of Parliament. <i>Medical journals.</i>
magazine	A business firm that publishes magazines. <i>You can program only the playback sequence of the discs in the magazine not individual tracks.</i>
message	Things bought on an errand; shopping. <i>Select an option to delete your mail messages.</i>
news	The quality of being sufficiently interesting to be reported in news bulletins. <i>The news of my death was greatly exaggerated.</i>
news report	The quality of being sufficiently interesting to be reported in news bulletins.
newscast	A radio or television broadcast of news reports.
newsflash	A short news announcement concerning some on-going news story.
newsletter	Report or open letter giving informal or confidential news of interest to a special group.
newspaper	The physical object that is the product of a newspaper publisher. <i>He read his newspaper at breakfast.</i>
notification	The action of notifying someone or something. <i>We have yet to receive formal notification of the announcement.</i>
periodical	A publication that appears at fixed intervals.
piece	A portable gun. <i>He needed a piece of granite.</i>
press release	A machine used for printing.
proceedings	A published report of a set of meetings or a conference. <i>Criminal proceedings were brought against him.</i>
report	An employee who reports to another employee. <i>Reports were circulating that the chairman was about to resign.</i>
review	A formal or official examination. <i>His case comes up for review in January.</i>
statement	A nonverbal message. <i>She made a statement to the police.</i>

story

A plot or storyline.
*The **story** of exposure to lead.*



Associations of "Bulletin" (30 Words)

acquaint

Make someone aware of or familiar with.
*Permit me to **acquaint** you with my son.*

broadcast

Broadcast over the airwaves as in radio or television.
*We don't want to **broadcast** our unhappiness to the world.*

broadcasting

The transmission of programmes or information by radio or television.
*The state monopoly on **broadcasting**.*

commentary

A set of explanatory or critical notes on a text.
*A live **commentary** on radio.*

communication	Social contact. <i>A telephone communication.</i>
consignee	The person to whom merchandise is delivered over.
<u>convey</u>	Make (an idea, impression, or feeling) known or understandable. <i>No application for registration is required when the property is conveyed following a court order.</i>
email	Send an email to someone. <i>Reading email has become the first task of the morning.</i>
informing	To furnish incriminating evidence to an officer of the law (usually in return for favors.
journalism	The product of the activity of journalism. <i>A collection of journalism.</i>
letter	Set down or print with letters. <i>Your personality matters far more than letters after your name.</i>
letterhead	A sheet of stationery with name and address of the organization printed at the top. <i>Write to the company's registered office which you can normally get from their letterhead.</i>
mail	Send someone email. <i>I'll mail you the check tomorrow.</i>
mailbox	A public box with a slot into which mail is placed for collection by the post office; a postbox.
mailing	The action or process of sending something by mail. <i>The postmark indicates the time of mailing.</i>
message	Send as a message. <i>She messaged the committee.</i>
notify	Give notice of or report (something) formally or officially. <i>You will be notified of our decision as soon as possible.</i>
philatelist	A collector and student of postage stamps.
philately	The collection and study of postage stamps.
post	Publicize with or as if with a poster. <i>Post a warning.</i>
<u>receiver</u>	A piece of radio or television apparatus that detects broadcast signals and converts them into visible or audible form. <i>He picked up the receiver.</i>
recipient	A person or thing that receives or is awarded something. <i>A recipient country.</i>

report	An employee who reports to another employee. <i>He heard reports that they were causing trouble.</i>
send	Send a message or letter. <i>Send your document as a PDF attachment.</i>
sender	Set used to broadcast radio or tv signals. <i>Senders of unwanted emails.</i>
spam	A canned meat made largely from pork. <i>An autogenerated spam website.</i>
stamp	Affix a stamp to. <i>His style stamps him as a player to watch.</i>
<u>telegraph</u>	A device for transmitting messages by telegraph. <i>She would rush off to telegraph news to her magazine.</i>
tidings	News; information. <i>The bearer of glad tidings.</i>
<u>transmit</u>	Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission. <i>Knowledge is transmitted from teacher to pupil.</i>
