### **Definitions of "Bullets" as a noun**

- *A pitch thrown with maximum velocity.*
- *A high-speed passenger train.*



## Synonyms of "Bullets" as a noun (6 Words)

**bullet train** A projectile that is fired from a gun.

**fastball** A pitch thrown with maximum velocity.  
*He swung late on the **fastball**.*

**heater** A pitch thrown with maximum velocity.  
*A gas water **heater**.*

**hummer** (baseball) a pitch thrown with maximum velocity.

**slug** (boxing) a blow with the fist.  
*He took a **slug** of hard liquor.*

**smoke** A hot vapor containing fine particles of carbon being produced by combustion.  
*He went outside for a **smoke**.*



## Associations of "Bullets" (30 Words)

- ammunition** A supply or quantity of bullets and shells.  
*Guns **ammunition** and explosives.*
- arrow** A projectile with a straight thin shaft and an arrowhead on one end and stabilizing vanes on the other intended to be shot from a bow.  
*His ability to launch an **arrow** accurately.*
- ballistic** Relating to projectiles or their flight.
- breech** Dress a boy in breeches after he had been in petticoats since birth.  
*In those days it wasn't customary to **breech** a boy until he was about four.*
- caliber** A degree or grade of excellence or worth.  
*An executive of low **caliber**.*
- cannon** Make a cannon.  
*They would cross at the Town ford under cover of the defending **cannon**.*

<b>cartridge</b>	Ammunition consisting of a cylindrical casing containing an explosive charge and a bullet; fired from a rifle or handgun. <i>He loaded a <b>cartridge</b> of fresh tape into the tape deck.</i>
<b>firearm</b>	A rifle, pistol, or other portable gun. <i>Jones pleaded guilty to possessing a <b>firearm</b> with criminal intent.</i>
<b>firing</b>	The act of firing weapons or artillery at an enemy. <i>The recent <b>firing</b> of the head of the department.</i>
<b>foam</b>	A lightweight form of rubber or plastic made by solidifying liquid foam. <i>Shaving <b>foam</b>.</i>
<b>fusillade</b>	Attack with fusillade. <i>Our <b>fusillade</b> from the left flank caught them by surprise.</i>
<b>grenade</b>	A glass receptacle containing chemicals which are released when the receptacle is thrown and broken, used for testing drains and extinguishing fires.
<b>gun</b>	Shoot with a gun. <i>The boom of the one o'clock <b>gun</b> echoed across the river.</i>
<b>gunshot</b>	The act of shooting a gun. <i>We bore down and came nearly within <b>gunshot</b>.</i>
<b>holster</b>	Put a gun into its holster. <i>He <b>holstered</b> the Browning before walking back.</i>
<b>misfire</b>	(especially of a plan) fail to produce the intended result. <i>As these nerves <b>misfire</b> and die the muscles begin to shrink.</i>
<b>missile</b>	A rocket carrying a warhead of conventional or nuclear explosives; may be ballistic or directed by remote control. <i>The plane disintegrated after being hit by a <b>missile</b> launched from the ground.</i>
<b>musket</b>	An infantryman's light gun with a long barrel, typically smooth-bored and fired from the shoulder. <i>A volley of <b>musket</b> fire.</i>
<b>muzzle</b>	Put a muzzle on an animal. <i><b>Muzzle</b> the dog to prevent it from biting strangers.</i>
<b>pistol</b>	Shoot someone with a pistol. <i>When we first met he was a <b>pistol</b> full of ideals and a natural leader.</i>
<b>projectile</b>	Denoting or relating to a projectile. <i>A <b>projectile</b> force.</i>
<b>revolver</b>	A door consisting of four orthogonal partitions that rotate about a central pivot; a door designed to equalize the air pressure in tall buildings.



<b>rifle</b>	Troops armed with rifles. <i>He lifted the <b>rifle</b> to his shoulder and fired.</i>
<b>salvo</b>	A simultaneous discharge of artillery or other guns in a battle. <i>The pardons provoked a <b>salvo</b> of accusations.</i>
<b>shoot</b>	The act of shooting at targets. <i>Claudia felt a pain <b>shoot</b> through her chest.</i>
<b>shooting</b>	The sport or pastime of shooting with a gun. <i>The events that led up to the <b>shooting</b> of the man.</i>
<b>shot</b>	A ball of stone or metal used as a missile shot from a large gun or cannon. <i>I caught him with a solid <b>shot</b> to the chin.</i>
<b>shotgun</b>	Shoot at or kill with a shotgun. <i>Many companies use the <b>shotgun</b> approach aiming advertising at the widest possible audience.</i>
<b>trajectory</b>	The path followed by an object moving through space. <i>The missile's <b>trajectory</b> was preset.</i>
<b>whizz</b>	Move or go quickly. <i>A computer <b>whizz</b>.</i>
