**beat**

Shape by beating.

Pure gold can be **beaten** out to form very thin sheets.



<b>break away</b>	Separate from a clinch, in boxing.
<b>escape</b>	Escape potentially unpleasant consequences get away with a forbidden action. <i>He drove along the dual carriageway to <b>escape</b> police.</i>
<b>fly the coop</b>	Move quickly or suddenly.
<b>head for the hills</b>	Direct the course; determine the direction of travelling.
<b>hightail it</b>	Flee; take to one's heels; cut and run.
<b>lam</b>	Give a thrashing to; beat hard. <i>They surged along <b>lamming</b> into anyone in their path.</i>
<b>run</b>	Be operating running or functioning. <i>Andrea <b>runs</b> her own catering business.</i>
<b>run away</b>	Direct or control; projects, businesses, etc.
<b>scarper</b>	Flee; take to one's heels; cut and run. <i>They left the stuff where it was and <b>scarpered</b>.</i>
<b>take to the woods</b>	Obtain by winning.
<b>turn tail</b>	Accomplish by rotating.

### **absurd**

An absurd state of affairs.

*The incidents that followed bordered on the **absurd**.*

### **apartment**

A suite of rooms usually on one floor of an apartment house.

*Self catering holiday **apartments**.*

### **bedroom**

A room used primarily for sleeping.

*All parents dream of children who tidy their **bedrooms** without being asked.*

### **bedside**

Space by the side of a bed (especially the bed of a sick or dying person).

*He was summoned to the **bedside** of a dying man.*

<b>berth</b>	Provide with a berth. <i>The ship <b>berthed</b> at Plymouth.</i>
<b>caravan</b>	Travel in a caravan. <i>We were part of a <b>caravan</b> of almost a thousand camels.</i>
<u><b>chamber</b></u>	Place in a chamber. <i>He <b>chambered</b> a fresh cartridge.</i>
<u><b>corner</b></u>	Solid exterior angle of a building especially one formed by a cornerstone. <i>Jan sat at one <b>corner</b> of the table.</i>
<b>doorstep</b>	(of a journalist) wait uninvited outside the home of (someone) in order to obtain an interview or photograph. <i>He was being <b>doorstepped</b> by the tabloids.</i>
<b>escape</b>	Interrupt an operation by means of the escape key. <i>The burglars <b>escaped</b> before the police showed up.</i>
<b>fool</b>	Make a fool or dupe of. <i>I felt a bit of a <b>fool</b>.</i>
<b>furnished</b>	Provided with whatever is necessary for a purpose (as furniture or equipment or authority). <i>A full sized fully <b>furnished</b> apartment.</i>
<b>gibberish</b>	Unintelligible talking. <i>He talks <b>gibberish</b>.</i>
<b>habitable</b>	Suitable or good enough to live in. <i>The house should be <b>habitable</b> by Christmas.</i>
<u><b>hostel</b></u>	An inn providing accommodation.
<u><b>irrational</b></u>	Of a number quantity or expression not expressible as a ratio of two integers and having an infinite and non recurring expansion when expressed as a decimal Examples of irrational numbers are the number and the square root of 2. <i><b>Irrational</b> numbers.</i>
<b>locus</b>	The effective or perceived location of something abstract. <i>A parabola is the <b>locus</b> of a point that moves so as to be equidistant from a fixed point and a straight line.</i>
<u><b>mumble</b></u>	Grind with the gums; chew without teeth and with great difficulty. <i>Sorry she <b>mumbled</b>.</i>
<u><b>mutation</b></u>	A distinct form resulting from genetic mutation. <i>His first novel went through several <b>mutations</b>.</i>
<u><b>nonsense</b></u>	Spoken or written words that have no meaning or make no sense. <i><b>Nonsense</b> poetry.</i>

<b>place</b>	Take a place in a competition often followed by an ordinal. <i><b>Place</b> a phone call.</i>
<b>prattle</b>	Talk at length in a foolish or inconsequential way. <i>She began to <b>prattle</b> on about her visit to the dentist.</i>
<u><b>room</b></u>	The people present in a room. <i>I was <b>rooming</b> with my cousin.</i>
<b>runaway</b>	An easy victory. <i>A teenage <b>runaway</b>.</i>
<b>silly</b>	Inspiring scornful pity- Dashiell Hammett. <i>Don't be a <b>silly</b>.</i>
<b>sleeper</b>	A ring or post worn in a pierced ear to keep the hole from closing. <i>A KGB plot to uncover his <b>sleepers</b>.</i>
<u><b>suite</b></u>	A set of programs with a uniform design and the ability to share data. <i>The Royal Saloon was built for the use of the Queen and her <b>suite</b>.</i>
<u><b>superstitious</b></u>	Showing ignorance of the laws of nature and faith in magic or chance. <i>Many <b>superstitious</b> beliefs and practices are connected with sneezing.</i>
<b>treetop</b>	The upper branches and leaves of a tree or other plant.
<b>upstairs</b>	With respect to the mind. <i>An <b>upstairs</b> bedroom.</i>
