
## **Burdened as an Adjective**

### Synonyms of "Burdened" as an adjective (2 Words)


**heavy-laden** Burdened by cares-Matt.11:28. **loaded down** Very drunk.

- Tree limbs burdened with ice.







# Associations of "Burdened" (30 Words)

burdensome	Difficult to carry out or fulfil; taxing. Bureaucratically <b>burdensome</b> assessment procedures.
cargo	Goods carried on a ship, aircraft, or motor vehicle. A <b>cargo</b> of oil.
demanding	Requiring more than usually expected or thought due; especially great patience and effort and skill. A baby can be so <b>demanding</b> .
difficult	Characterized by or causing hardships or problems. A <b>difficult</b> economic climate.
encumber	Hold back. They had arrived <b>encumber</b> ed with families.
encumbrance	An onerous or difficult concern. The horse raised its hind leg as if to rid itself of an <b>encumbrance</b> .
exacting	Having complicated nutritional requirements; especially growing only in special artificial cultures. <i>Certain highly specialized xerophytes are extremely</i> <b>exacting</b> <i>in their requirements.</i>
expeditionary	(used of military forces) designed for military operations abroad. An <b>expeditionary</b> force.
<u>grueling</u>	Characterized by effort to the point of exhaustion; especially physical effort. A <b>grueling</b> campaign.
heavy	A thing such as a vehicle that is large or heavy of its kind. <i>Iago is the <b>heavy</b> role in Othello.</i>
inequitable	Not equitable or fair. <i>Inequitable taxation</i> .
laborious	(of speech or writing style) showing obvious signs of effort and lacking in fluency. She wrote in <b>laborious</b> dictionary assisted English.
lade	Ship (goods) as cargo. <i>Vessels <b>lade</b> there.</i>
<u>laden</u>	Remove with or as if with a ladle. <i>Laden</i> with grief.
lading	A cargo.



load	Of a ship or vehicle take on a load. The King and Queen <b>load</b> ed Columbus with wealth and honours.
loaded	Having an abundant supply of money or possessions of value. A tray <b>loaded</b> with dishes.
luggage	Suitcases or other bags in which to pack personal belongings for travelling. Upon landing we waited and waited for our <b>luggage</b> .
onerous	Not easily borne; wearing. My duties weren t <b>onerous</b> I only had to greet the guests.
onus	Something that is one's duty or responsibility. The <b>onus</b> is on you to show that you have suffered loss.
oppress	Come down on or keep down by unjust use of one's authority. A system which <b>oppress</b> ed working people.
packing	The action or process of packing something. 2 plus postage and <b>packing</b> .
shipment	The action of shipping goods. The <b>shipment</b> arrived at Liverpool.
taxing	Physically or mentally demanding. They find the work too <b>taxing</b> .
<u>tricky</u>	Marked by skill in deception. Applying eyeliner can be a <b>tricky</b> business.
troublesome	Difficult to deal with. A <b>troublesome</b> situation.
<u>uncomfortable</u>	Conducive to or feeling mental discomfort. He began to feel <b>uncomfortable</b> at the man s hard stare.
<u>unload</u>	Leave or unload. <b>Unload</b> the cargo.
wearing	Geology the mechanical process of wearing or grinding something down as by particles washing over it. A plan of action will make the whole event a less <b>wearing</b> experience.
<u>weight</u>	Weight down with a load. He placed two <b>weight</b> s in the scale pan.
