Associations of "Burdening" (30 Words)

burdensome	Undesirably restrictive. <i>The burdensome responsibilities of professional life.</i>
cargo	Goods carried by a large vehicle. <i>A cargo of oil.</i>
demanding	(of a person) making others work hard or meet high standards; not easily satisfied. <i>He was a demanding baby and rarely slept through the night.</i>
difficult	Hard to control. <i>A difficult task.</i>
encumber	Restrict (someone or something) so as to make free movement difficult. <i>She was encumbered by her heavy skirts.</i>
encumbrance	An onerous or difficult concern. <i>Details of encumbrances on property.</i>
exacting	Making great demands on one’s skill, attention, or other resources. <i>An exacting job.</i>
expeditionary	Of or forming an expedition, especially a military expedition. <i>The French expeditionary force in Indochina.</i>
grueling	Characterized by effort to the point of exhaustion; especially physical effort. <i>A grueling campaign.</i>
heavy	A thing such as a vehicle that is large or heavy of its kind. <i>A heavy grade.</i>
inequitable	Not equitable or fair. <i>Inequitable taxation.</i>
laborious	(of speech or writing style) showing obvious signs of effort and lacking in fluency. <i>Spent many laborious hours on the project.</i>

lade	Put cargo on board (a ship). <i>Vessels lade there.</i>
laden	Fill or place a load on. <i>A tree laden with apples.</i>
lading	The action of loading a ship with cargo.
load	Of a ship or vehicle take on a load. <i>Load the truck with hay.</i>
loaded	Charged with ammunition. <i>A heavily loaded freight train.</i>
luggage	Past experiences or long-held ideas and opinions perceived as burdensome encumbrances. <i>Carrying emotional luggage from the past.</i>
onerous	Not easily borne; wearing. <i>My duties weren't onerous I only had to greet the guests.</i>
onus	An onerous or difficult concern. <i>The onus is on you to show that you have suffered loss.</i>
oppress	Keep (someone) in subjection and hardship, especially by the unjust exercise of authority. <i>The government oppresses political activists.</i>
packing	A charge made when delivering goods to cover the cost of packing them. <i>Gun packing drug dealers have turned the area into a war zone.</i>
shipment	The act of sending off something. <i>Logs waiting for shipment.</i>
taxing	Physically or mentally demanding. <i>They find the work too taxing.</i>
tricky	Not to be trusted. <i>Tricky Dick.</i>
troublesome	Difficult to deal with. <i>A troublesome situation.</i>
uncomfortable	Causing or feeling slight pain or physical discomfort. <i>An uncomfortable chair.</i>
unload	Leave or unload. <i>He had unloaded his depreciating stock on his unsuspecting wife.</i>
wearing	Geology the mechanical process of wearing or grinding something down as by particles washing over it. <i>It would be a lot less wearing if we could work together amicably.</i>
