## Associations of "Burdening" (30 Words)

<b>burdensome</b>	Undesirably restrictive. <i>The <b>burdensome</b> responsibilities of professional life.</i>
<b>cargo</b>	Goods carried by a large vehicle. <i>A <b>cargo</b> of oil.</i>
<b>demanding</b>	(of a person) making others work hard or meet high standards; not easily satisfied. <i>He was a <b>demanding</b> baby and rarely slept through the night.</i>
<b>difficult</b>	Hard to control. <i>A <b>difficult</b> task.</i>
<b>encumber</b>	Restrict (someone or something) so as to make free movement difficult. <i>She was <b>encumbered</b> by her heavy skirts.</i>
<b>encumbrance</b>	An onerous or difficult concern. <i>Details of <b>encumbrances</b> on property.</i>
<b>exacting</b>	Making great demands on one’s skill, attention, or other resources. <i>An <b>exacting</b> job.</i>
<b>expeditionary</b>	Of or forming an expedition, especially a military expedition. <i>The French <b>expeditionary</b> force in Indochina.</i>
<b>grueling</b>	Characterized by effort to the point of exhaustion; especially physical effort. <i>A <b>grueling</b> campaign.</i>
<b>heavy</b>	A thing such as a vehicle that is large or heavy of its kind. <i>A <b>heavy</b> grade.</i>
<b>inequitable</b>	Not equitable or fair. <i><b>Inequitable</b> taxation.</i>
<b>laborious</b>	(of speech or writing style) showing obvious signs of effort and lacking in fluency. <i>Spent many <b>laborious</b> hours on the project.</i>

<b>lade</b>	Put cargo on board (a ship). <i>Vessels <b>lade</b> there.</i>
<b>laden</b>	Fill or place a load on. <i>A tree <b>laden</b> with apples.</i>
<b>lading</b>	The action of loading a ship with cargo.
<b>load</b>	Of a ship or vehicle take on a load. <i><b>Load</b> the truck with hay.</i>
<b>loaded</b>	Charged with ammunition. <i>A heavily <b>loaded</b> freight train.</i>
<b>luggage</b>	Past experiences or long-held ideas and opinions perceived as burdensome encumbrances. <i>Carrying emotional <b>luggage</b> from the past.</i>
<b>onerous</b>	Not easily borne; wearing. <i>My duties weren't <b>onerous</b> I only had to greet the guests.</i>
<b>onus</b>	An onerous or difficult concern. <i>The <b>onus</b> is on you to show that you have suffered loss.</i>
<b>oppress</b>	Keep (someone) in subjection and hardship, especially by the unjust exercise of authority. <i>The government <b>oppresses</b> political activists.</i>
<b>packing</b>	A charge made when delivering goods to cover the cost of packing them. <i>Gun <b>packing</b> drug dealers have turned the area into a war zone.</i>
<b>shipment</b>	The act of sending off something. <i>Logs waiting for <b>shipment</b>.</i>
<b>taxing</b>	Physically or mentally demanding. <i>They find the work too <b>taxing</b>.</i>
<b>tricky</b>	Not to be trusted. <i><b>Tricky</b> Dick.</i>
<b>troublesome</b>	Difficult to deal with. <i>A <b>troublesome</b> situation.</i>
<b>uncomfortable</b>	Causing or feeling slight pain or physical discomfort. <i>An <b>uncomfortable</b> chair.</i>
<b>unload</b>	Leave or unload. <i>He had <b>unloaded</b> his depreciating stock on his unsuspecting wife.</i>
<b>wearing</b>	Geology the mechanical process of wearing or grinding something down as by particles washing over it. <i>It would be a lot less <b>wearing</b> if we could work together amicably.</i>
