<u>bloom</u>	Produce or yield flowers. <i>The remastering has lost some of the bloom of the strings.</i>
<u>blossom</u>	Mature or develop in a promising or healthy way. <i>Youth blossomed into maturity.</i>
bonanza	A large amount of something desirable. <i>A natural gas bonanza for Britain.</i>
bonus	An extra and unexpected advantage. <i>Good weather is an added bonus but the real appeal is the landscape.</i>
<u>boom</u>	Make a loud, deep, resonant sound. <i>A dozen bitterns boom mysteriously from the reeds.</i>
<u>booming</u>	Used of the voice. <i>A booming laugh.</i>
daisy	Used in names of other plants of the daisy family e g Michaelmas daisy Shasta daisy.
ding	Go ding dong like a bell. <i>Cash registers were dinging softly.</i>
efflorescence	The period of greatest prosperity or productivity. <i>Cover the brickwork to minimize efflorescence.</i>
fanfare	Media attention or elaborate ceremony. <i>The studio released this film with great fanfare but no commercial success.</i>

flourish	A display of ornamental speech or language. <i>She entered with a great flourish.</i>
flourishing	Very lively and profitable. <i>A flourishing career.</i>
grow	Cultivate by growing often involving improvements by means of agricultural techniques. <i>Her hair doesn't grow much anymore.</i>
growth	A tumour or other abnormal formation. <i>A day's growth of unshaven stubble on his chin.</i>
<u>inflation</u>	The action of inflating something or the condition of being inflated. <i>High inflation rates.</i>
metropolis	A large and densely populated urban area; may include several independent administrative districts. <i>By the late eighteenth century Edo had grown to a metropolis with a population of nearly one million.</i>
opulence	Wealth as evidenced by sumptuous living. <i>Rooms of spectacular opulence.</i>
palmy	Covered with palms. <i>A palmy time for stockbrokers.</i>
prosper	Flourish physically; grow strong and healthy. <i>The state hopes to prosper from free trade with the United States.</i>
prosperous	Very lively and profitable. <i>A prosperous moment to make a decision.</i>
rich	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>A rich and famous family.</i>
successful	Having achieved fame, wealth, or social status. <i>Marketing of Japanese products has been highly successful.</i>
teem	Be teeming be abuzz. <i>Every garden is teeming with wildlife.</i>
<u>thrive</u>	Prosper; flourish. <i>Education groups thrive on organization.</i>
thriving	Very lively and profitable. <i>A thriving tourist center.</i>
well-to-do	Doctor's degree in osteopathy.
