- *United States jurist appointed chief justice of the United States Supreme Court by Richard Nixon (1907-1995).*

<b>bacon</b>	English statesman and philosopher; precursor of British empiricism; advocated inductive reasoning (1561-1626). <i>Crisp rashers of <b>bacon</b>.</i>
<b>baked</b>	Dried out by heat or excessive exposure to sunlight. <i>Land lying <b>baked</b> in the heat.</i>
<b>baste</b>	Pour fat or juices over (meat) during cooking in order to keep it moist. <i><b>Baste</b> a roast.</i>
<b>beef</b>	The flesh of a cow, bull, or ox, used as food. <i>Getting caught with pot in the sixties was a narco <b>beef</b>.</i>
<b>butter</b>	Spread butter on. <i>Lily <b>buttered</b> a slice of toast.</i>
<u><a href="#">cheese</a></u>	Wind onto a cheese. <i>A <b>cheese</b> sandwich.</i>

<b>coke</b>	Convert coal into coke. <i>Petroleum oils <b>coke</b> after distillation.</i>
<b>creamery</b>	A workplace where dairy products (butter and cheese etc.) are produced or sold.
<b>dairy</b>	A farm where dairy products are produced. <i>I rely on soya as a substitute for <b>dairy</b>.</i>
<b>deli</b>	A shop selling ready-to-eat food products.
<b>fillet</b>	A roller used to impress a fillet on the cover of a book. <i>Roast <b>fillet</b> of lamb.</i>
<b>ham</b>	Salted or smoked meat from the upper part of a pig's leg. <i>A honey baked <b>ham</b>.</i>
<b>hamburger</b>	A sandwich consisting of a fried cake of minced beef served on a bun, often with other ingredients.
<b>livestock</b>	Farm animals regarded as an asset. <i>Markets for the trading of <b>livestock</b>.</i>
<b>meat</b>	The inner and usually edible part of a seed or grain or nut or fruit stone. <i>Pieces of <b>meat</b>.</i>
<b>milk</b>	Take milk from female mammals. <i>Executives <b>milked</b> the health plan s funds for their personal use.</i>
<b>mutton</b>	Meat from a mature domestic sheep. <i>A leg of <b>mutton</b>.</i>
<b>pizza</b>	Italian open pie made of thin bread dough spread with a spiced mixture of e.g. tomato sauce and cheese. <i>A <b>pizza</b> restaurant.</i>
<b>pork</b>	Gorge oneself with food. <i><b>Pork</b> chops.</i>
<b>roast</b>	Of food having been roasted. <i>This is the <b>roast</b> most likely to be used in espresso.</i>
<b>sandwich</b>	Something that is constructed like or has the form of a sandwich. <i>A ham <b>sandwich</b>.</i>
<b>sausage</b>	An object shaped like a sausage. <i>Her hair hung in glossy black <b>sausage</b> curls.</i>
<b>sirloin</b>	Good-quality beef cut from the loin. <i>Fresh <b>sirloin</b> steaks.</i>
<b>smoked</b>	(used especially of meats and fish) dried and cured by hanging in wood smoke. <i>A plate of <b>smoked</b> salmon.</i>

<b>steak</b>	A thick slice of steak or other high quality meat or fish. <i>A fillet <b>steak</b>.</i>
<b>stew</b>	Food prepared by stewing especially meat or fish with vegetables. <i>Sweaty clothes left to <b>stew</b> in a plastic bag.</i>
<b>tenderloin</b>	A city district known for its vice and high crime rate. <i>Every city has a <b>tenderloin</b>.</i>
<b>toaster</b>	A kitchen appliance (usually electric) for toasting bread.
<b>veal</b>	Meat from a calf. <i><b>Veal</b> and ham pie.</i>
<b>venison</b>	Meat from a deer used as food. <i><b>Venison</b> steaks.</i>
