<u>crowded</u>	Overfilled or compacted or concentrated. A crowded program.
full	Constituting the full quantity or extent complete. <i>She could only nod for her mouth was full.</i>



<u>hectic</u>	Marked by intense agitation or emotion. A hectic business schedule.
lively	Difficult or challenging. Her lively mind.
swarming	Moving in or forming a large or dense group. A swarming mass of bodies.
<u>teeming</u>	Full of people or things; crowded. The teeming boulevard.
thronged	Filled with great numbers crowded together. I try to avoid the thronged streets and stores just before Christmas.
<u>vibrant</u>	Full of energy and life. The men s vibrant voices.

briskly	In an active, quick, or energetic way. She walked briskly into the building.

cheerily	In a happy and optimistic way. <i>He chats cheerily about city living.</i>

<u>effervescent</u>	Marked by high spirits or excitement. <i>Effervescent</i> young people.
effusive	Relating to the eruption of large volumes of molten rock. An <i>effusive</i> welcome.
<u>energetic</u>	Relating to or characterized by energy (in the technical sense. Moderately energetic exercise.
enterprising	Having or showing initiative and resourcefulness. An enterprising young man likely to go far.
eventful	Full of events or incidents. The most exhausting and eventful day of my life.
indefatigable	Showing sustained enthusiastic action with unflagging vitality. An indefatigable advocate of equal rights.
<u>industrious</u>	Characterized by hard work and perseverance. An industrious people striving to make their country prosperous.
lively	Difficult or challenging. This whole lively world.
metropolis	A large and densely populated urban area; may include several independent administrative districts. He preferred the peaceful life of the countryside to the bustle of the metropolis .
propulsive	Having the power to propel. The propulsive rhythm of a fast train.
scintillating	Brilliantly and excitingly clever or skilful. The team produced a scintillating second half performance.
sporting	Connected with or interested in sport. <i>Sporting</i> blood.
sprightly	Full of spirit and vitality. A sprightly dance.
strenuous	Characterized by or performed with much energy or force. <i>Strenuous</i> exercise.



striving	An effortful attempt to attain a goal.
thriving	Very lively and profitable. Did a thriving business in orchids.
<u>tireless</u>	Showing sustained enthusiastic action with unflagging vitality. <i>A tireless campaigner.</i>
unflagging	Showing sustained enthusiastic action with unflagging vitality. <i>Unflagging pursuit of excellence.</i>
<u>vibrant</u>	Of colors that are bright and striking. A vibrant group that challenged the system.
<u>vigorous</u>	Characterized by forceful and energetic action or activity. <i>Vigorous</i> opposition to the war.
