- teeming** Full of people or things; crowded.  
*The **teeming** boulevard.*
- thronged** Filled with great numbers crowded together.  
*I try to avoid the **thronged** streets and stores just before Christmas.*
- vibrant** Full of energy and life.  
*The men s **vibrant** voices.*

<b>eventful</b>	Full of events or incidents. <i>The most exhausting and <b>eventful</b> day of my life.</i>
<b>indefatigable</b>	Showing sustained enthusiastic action with unflagging vitality. <i>An <b>indefatigable</b> advocate of equal rights.</i>
<b>industrious</b>	Characterized by hard work and perseverance. <i>An <b>industrious</b> people striving to make their country prosperous.</i>
<b>lively</b>	Difficult or challenging. <i>This whole <b>lively</b> world.</i>
<b>metropolis</b>	A large and densely populated urban area; may include several independent administrative districts. <i>He preferred the peaceful life of the countryside to the bustle of the <b>metropolis</b>.</i>
<b>propulsive</b>	Having the power to propel. <i>The <b>propulsive</b> rhythm of a fast train.</i>
<b>scintillating</b>	Brilliantly and excitingly clever or skilful. <i>The team produced a <b>scintillating</b> second half performance.</i>
<b>sporting</b>	Connected with or interested in sport. <i><b>Sporting</b> blood.</i>
<b>sprightly</b>	Full of spirit and vitality. <i>A <b>sprightly</b> dance.</i>
<b>strenuous</b>	Characterized by or performed with much energy or force. <i><b>Strenuous</b> exercise.</i>

***Unflagging** pursuit of excellence.*
- vibrant** Of colors that are bright and striking.  
*A **vibrant** group that challenged the system.*
- vigorous** Characterized by forceful and energetic action or activity.  
***Vigorous** opposition to the war.*
