## Associations of "By any chance" (30 Words)

<b><a href="#">able</a></b>	Having considerable skill proficiency or intelligence. <i><b>Able</b> to learn.</i>
<b><a href="#">anyhow</a></b>	Used to indicate that a statement explains or supports a previous statement. <i>They came <b>anyhow</b> they could.</i>
<b><a href="#">anyway</a></b>	Used to indicate that something happened or will happen in spite of something else. <i>Get it done <b>anyway</b> you can.</i>
<b><a href="#">bound</a></b>	Bound by an oath. <i><b>Bound</b> and gagged hostages.</i>
<b><a href="#">expected</a></b>	Considered likely or probable to happen or arrive. <i>Write down your <b>expected</b> monthly income and regularly track your expenses.</i>
<b><a href="#">expedient</a></b>	Appropriate to a purpose; practical. <i>Holding a public enquiry into the scheme was not <b>expedient</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">hundred</a></b>	A subdivision of a county or shire, having its own court. <i>Wantage <b>Hundred</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">likelihood</a></b>	The probability of a specified outcome. <i>Situations where there is a <b>likelihood</b> of violence.</i>
<b><a href="#">likely</a></b>	Likely but not certain to be or become true or real. <i>These services are <b>likely</b> to be available to us all before long.</i>
<b><a href="#">maybe</a></b>	A mere possibility or probability. <i>He was standing <b>maybe</b> 20 or 30 feet away.</i>
<b><a href="#">opportune</a></b>	Done or occurring at a favourable time; well timed. <i>An <b>opportune</b> time to receive guests.</i>
<b><a href="#">opportunity</a></b>	A time or set of circumstances that makes it possible to do something. <i>The holiday gave us the <b>opportunity</b> to visit Washington.</i>

<b>percent</b>	A proportion in relation to a whole (which is usually the amount per hundred).
<b>percentage</b>	An amount, such as an allowance or commission, that is a proportion of a larger sum of money. <i>I hope to be on a <b>percentage</b>.</i>
<b>perhaps</b>	Used to express uncertainty or possibility. <i><b>Perhaps</b> she will call tomorrow.</i>
<b>plausible</b>	(of a person) skilled at producing persuasive arguments, especially ones intended to deceive. <i>A <b>plausible</b> liar.</i>
<b>possibility</b>	Capability of existing or happening or being true. <i>There is no <b>possibility</b> of any government achieving this level of expenditure.</i>
<b>possible</b>	The highest possible score especially in a shooting competition. <i>Children need the best education <b>possible</b>.</i>
<b>possibly</b>	By chance. <i>He found himself alone <b>possibly</b> the only survivor.</i>
<b>potential</b>	Existing in possibility. <i><b>Potential</b> clients.</i>
<b>potentiality</b>	An aptitude that may be developed. <i>There is concern over the <b>potentiality</b> of violence.</i>
<b>preferably</b>	More readily or willingly. <i>Clean it well <b>preferably</b> with warm water.</i>
<b>presumable</b>	Capable of being inferred on slight grounds.
<b>presumptive</b>	Having a reasonable basis for belief or acceptance. <i>The <b>presumptive</b> heir or heir apparent.</i>
<b>probability</b>	The quality or state of being probable; the extent to which something is likely to happen or be the case. <i>Going by past experience there was a high <b>probability</b> that the visitors were lost.</i>
<b>probable</b>	Apparently destined. <i>The <b>probable</b> consequences of going ahead with the scheme.</i>
<b>probably</b>	With considerable certainty; without much doubt. <i>He is <b>probably</b> out of the country.</i>
<b>prospect</b>	Search for something desirable. <i>Some training which offered a <b>prospect</b> of continuous employment.</i>

**rather**

Used before verbs so as to make the expression of a feeling or opinion less assertive.

*It was **rather** cold.*

**whatever**

No matter what happens.

*They received no help **whatever**.*
