Associations of "By any chance" (30 Words)

<u>able</u>	Having considerable skill proficiency or intelligence. <i>Able to learn.</i>
<u>anyhow</u>	Used to indicate that a statement explains or supports a previous statement. <i>They came anyhow they could.</i>
<u>anyway</u>	Used to indicate that something happened or will happen in spite of something else. <i>Get it done anyway you can.</i>
<u>bound</u>	Bound by an oath. <i>Bound and gagged hostages.</i>
<u>expected</u>	Considered likely or probable to happen or arrive. <i>Write down your expected monthly income and regularly track your expenses.</i>
<u>expedient</u>	Appropriate to a purpose; practical. <i>Holding a public enquiry into the scheme was not expedient.</i>
<u>hundred</u>	A subdivision of a county or shire, having its own court. <i>Wantage Hundred.</i>
<u>likelihood</u>	The probability of a specified outcome. <i>Situations where there is a likelihood of violence.</i>
<u>likely</u>	Likely but not certain to be or become true or real. <i>These services are likely to be available to us all before long.</i>
<u>maybe</u>	A mere possibility or probability. <i>He was standing maybe 20 or 30 feet away.</i>
<u>opportune</u>	Done or occurring at a favourable time; well timed. <i>An opportune time to receive guests.</i>
<u>opportunity</u>	A time or set of circumstances that makes it possible to do something. <i>The holiday gave us the opportunity to visit Washington.</i>

percent	A proportion in relation to a whole (which is usually the amount per hundred).
percentage	An amount, such as an allowance or commission, that is a proportion of a larger sum of money. <i>I hope to be on a percentage.</i>
perhaps	Used to express uncertainty or possibility. <i>Perhaps she will call tomorrow.</i>
plausible	(of a person) skilled at producing persuasive arguments, especially ones intended to deceive. <i>A plausible liar.</i>
possibility	Capability of existing or happening or being true. <i>There is no possibility of any government achieving this level of expenditure.</i>
possible	The highest possible score especially in a shooting competition. <i>Children need the best education possible.</i>
possibly	By chance. <i>He found himself alone possibly the only survivor.</i>
potential	Existing in possibility. <i>Potential clients.</i>
potentiality	An aptitude that may be developed. <i>There is concern over the potentiality of violence.</i>
preferably	More readily or willingly. <i>Clean it well preferably with warm water.</i>
presumable	Capable of being inferred on slight grounds.
presumptive	Having a reasonable basis for belief or acceptance. <i>The presumptive heir or heir apparent.</i>
probability	The quality or state of being probable; the extent to which something is likely to happen or be the case. <i>Going by past experience there was a high probability that the visitors were lost.</i>
probable	Apparently destined. <i>The probable consequences of going ahead with the scheme.</i>
probably	With considerable certainty; without much doubt. <i>He is probably out of the country.</i>
prospect	Search for something desirable. <i>Some training which offered a prospect of continuous employment.</i>

rather

Used before verbs so as to make the expression of a feeling or opinion less assertive.

*It was **rather** cold.*

whatever

No matter what happens.

*They received no help **whatever**.*
