<u>able</u>	Having considerable skill proficiency or intelligence. <i>Able</i> to learn.
<u>anyhow</u>	Used to indicate that a statement explains or supports a previous statement. <i>They came anyhow they could.</i>
<u>anyway</u>	Used to indicate that something happened or will happen in spite of something else. <i>Get it done anyway you can.</i>
<u>bound</u>	Bound by an oath. Bound and gagged hostages.
<u>expected</u>	Considered likely or probable to happen or arrive. Write down your expected monthly income and regularly track your expenses.
expedient	Appropriate to a purpose; practical. <i>Holding a public enquiry into the scheme was not</i> expedient .
hundred	A subdivision of a county or shire, having its own court. <i>Wantage Hundred</i> .
<u>likelihood</u>	The probability of a specified outcome. Situations where there is a likelihood of violence.
likely	Likely but not certain to be or become true or real. These services are likely to be available to us all before long.
<u>maybe</u>	A mere possibility or probability. He was standing maybe 20 or 30 feet away.
<u>opportune</u>	Done or occurring at a favourable time; well timed. An opportune time to receive guests.
opportunity	A time or set of circumstances that makes it possible to do something. The holiday gave us the opportunity to visit Washington.



percent	A proportion in relation to a whole (which is usually the amount per hundred.
percentage	An amount, such as an allowance or commission, that is a proportion of a larger sum of money. I hope to be on a percentage .
perhaps	Used to express uncertainty or possibility. Perhaps she will call tomorrow.
plausible	(of a person) skilled at producing persuasive arguments, especially ones intended to deceive. <i>A plausible liar</i> .
possibility	Capability of existing or happening or being true. There is no possibility of any government achieving this level of expenditure.
<u>possible</u>	The highest possible score especially in a shooting competition. <i>Children need the best education</i> possible .
possibly	By chance. He found himself alone possibly the only survivor.
potential	Existing in possibility. <i>Potential</i> clients.
potentiality	An aptitude that may be developed. There is concern over the potentiality of violence.
preferably	More readily or willingly. Clean it well preferably with warm water.
presumable	Capable of being inferred on slight grounds.
presumptive	Having a reasonable basis for belief or acceptance. The presumptive heir or heir apparent.
<u>probability</u>	The quality or state of being probable; the extent to which something is likely to happen or be the case. Going by past experience there was a high probability that the visitors were lost.
<u>probable</u>	Apparently destined. The probable consequences of going ahead with the scheme.
<u>probably</u>	With considerable certainty; without much doubt. <i>He is probably out of the country.</i>
prospect	Search for something desirable. Some training which offered a prospect of continuous employment.



<u>rather</u>	Used before verbs so as to make the expression of a feeling or opinion less assertive.
	It was rather cold.
<u>whatever</u>	No matter what happens. They received no help whatever .
