### Definitions of "Cafe" as a noun

- *A small restaurant selling light meals and drinks.*
- *A bar or nightclub.*
- *A small restaurant where drinks and snacks are sold.*
- *A shop selling sweets, cigarettes, newspapers, etc. and staying open after normal hours.*



## Synonyms of "Cafe" as a noun (6 Words)

- buffet** A meal set out on a buffet at which guests help themselves.  
*A cold **buffet** lunch.*
- cafeteria** A restaurant in which customers serve themselves from a counter and pay before eating.  
*Employers who offer **cafeteria** plans and other flexible programs.*
- coffee bar** Any of several small trees and shrubs native to the tropical Old World yielding coffee beans.
- coffee shop** A beverage consisting of an infusion of ground coffee beans.
- coffeehouse** A small restaurant where drinks and snacks are sold.
- snack bar** A light informal meal.

- bakery** Baked goods such as bread and cakes.  
*Bakery items.*
- bookshop** A shop where books are sold.

<b>bread</b>	Cover with bread crumbs. <i>A <b>bread</b> roll.</i>
<b>cake</b>	Baked goods made from or based on a mixture of flour, sugar, eggs, and fat. <i>A fruit <b>cake</b>.</i>
<b>candy</b>	A rich sweet made of flavored sugar and often combined with fruit or nuts. <i>Making <b>candy</b> at home is not difficult the key is cooking the syrup to the right temperature.</i>
<b>chef</b>	Work as a chef. <i>He <b>cheffed</b> on a yacht in the Riviera for two years.</i>
<b>chocolate</b>	A sweet made of or covered with chocolate. <i>The former Great Western colours of <b>chocolate</b> and cream.</i>
<b>coffee</b>	The shrub which yields coffee seeds native to the Old World tropics. <i>He ordered a cup of <b>coffee</b>.</i>
<b>confection</b>	Make into a confection. <i>His elaborate pop <b>confections</b>.</i>
<b>confectionery</b>	A shop that sells sweets and chocolates. <i>Items of <b>confectionery</b>.</i>
<b>cookery</b>	The practice or skill of preparing and cooking food. <i>Italian regional <b>cookery</b>.</i>
<b>cookie</b>	A person of a specified kind. <i>Chocolate chip <b>cookies</b>.</i>
<b>cooking</b>	Suitable for or used in cooking. <i><b>Cooking</b> can be a great art.</i>
<b>deli</b>	A shop selling ready-to-eat food products.
<b>dessert</b>	The sweet course eaten at the end of a meal. <i>A <b>dessert</b> of chocolate mousse.</i>
<b>flour</b>	Cover with flour. <i><b>Flour</b> fish or meat before frying it.</i>
<b>franchise</b>	Grant a franchise to an individual or group. <i>Fast food <b>franchises</b> dot the roadside.</i>
<b>goody</b>	Something attractive or desirable, especially something tasty to eat.
<b>grocer</b>	A retail merchant who sells foodstuffs (and some household supplies).
<b>homemade</b>	Made or produced in the home or by yourself. <i><b>Homemade</b> bread.</i>
<b>pastry</b>	An item of food consisting of sweet pastry with a cream jam or fruit filling. <i>Spread the mixture over the <b>pastry</b>.</i>



<b>pretzel</b>	A crisp biscuit baked in the form of a knot or stick and flavoured with salt. <i>He found the snake <b>pretzeled</b> into a tangle of knots.</i>
<b>pub</b>	Frequent pubs. <i>Let s go to the <b>pub</b>.</i>
<b>restaurant</b>	A building where people go to eat.
<b>shop</b>	An act of going shopping. <i>They <b>shopped</b> around for cheaper food.</i>
<b>snack</b>	Eat a snack eat lightly. <i>She never loses weight because she <b>snacks</b> between meals.</i>
<b>soup</b>	Any composition having a consistency suggestive of soup. <i>A bowl of tomato <b>soup</b>.</i>
<b>tea</b>	Drink tea or take afternoon tea. <i>The store shelves held many different kinds of <b>tea</b>.</i>
<b>vino</b>	Wine, especially that which is cheap or of inferior quality.
<b>wine</b>	Treat to wine. <i>He opened a bottle of red <b>wine</b>.</i>
