- done on purpose** Cooked until ready to serve.
- intended** Planned or meant.

*My signature is extremely hard to **counterfeit**.*
- deliberate** Done consciously and intentionally.  
*Jurors **deliberated** the fate of those charged.*
- deliberately** In a deliberate unhurried manner.  
*The fire was started **deliberately**.*
- designed** Done or made or performed with purpose and intent- Havelock Ellis.  
*The aircraft performed their **designed** functions well.*

<b>intended</b>	Future; betrothed. <i>The <b>intended</b> victim escaped.</i>
<b>intentional</b>	Done or made or performed with purpose and intent. <i><b>Intentional</b> wrongdoing and harm.</i>
<b>intentionality</b>	The fact of being deliberate or purposive.
<b>intentionally</b>	With intention; in an intentional manner. <i>I wasn't sure if it was <b>intentionally</b> funny or not.</i>
<b>knowingly</b>	In full awareness or consciousness; deliberately. <i>When a journalist <b>knowingly</b> misleads their readers.</i>
<b>measured</b>	Having notes of fixed rhythmic value. <i>His <b>measured</b> prose.</i>
<b>muse</b>	A person or personified force who is the source of inspiration for a creative artist. <i>Yeats <b>muse</b> Maud Gonne.</i>
<b>plan</b>	Make or work out a plan for devise. <i>The UN peace <b>plan</b>.</i>
<b>ploy</b>	An activity done for amusement. <i>The eternal cross stitch I was set to do before I could indulge my own <b>ploys</b>.</i>
<b>premeditated</b>	Characterized by deliberate purpose and some degree of planning. <i>A <b>premeditated</b> crime.</i>
<b>purpose</b>	The quality of being determined to do or achieve something firmness of purpose. <i>State pensions are considered as earned income for tax <b>purposes</b>.</i>
<b>purposeful</b>	Intentional. <i><b>Purposeful</b> activities.</i>
<b>purposefully</b>	In a way that shows determination or resolve. <i>We <b>purposefully</b> avoided addressing the problem.</i>
<b>purposely</b>	On purpose; intentionally. <i>She had <b>purposely</b> made it difficult.</i>
<b>sabotage</b>	The action of sabotaging something. <i>Power lines from South Africa were <b>sabotaged</b> by rebel forces.</i>
<b>scheme</b>	Devise a system or form a scheme for. <i>The whole <b>scheme</b> is plunged into darkness bar the light in Victor's house.</i>



<b>skillfully</b>	With skill. <i>Fragments of a nearly complete jug <b>skillfully</b> restored at the institute of archaeology.</i>
<b>stratagem</b>	A maneuver in a game or conversation. <i>A series of devious <b>stratagems</b>.</i>
<b>strategy</b>	The art of planning and directing overall military operations and movements in a war or battle. <i>Shifts in marketing <b>strategy</b>.</i>
<b>thoughtful</b>	Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention. <i>Brows drawn together in <b>thoughtful</b> consideration.</i>
<b>trick</b>	Intended or used to deceive or mystify, or to create an illusion. <i>The <b>trick</b> is to put one ski forward and kneel.</i>
<b>willfully</b>	In a willful manner. <i>She had <b>willfully</b> deceived me.</i>
<b>wittingly</b>	With full knowledge and deliberation. <i>He <b>wittingly</b> deleted the references.</i>
