Calendar as a Noun

Definitions of "Calendar" as a noun

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "calendar" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- A book in which to note daily appointments.
- A chart or series of pages showing the days, weeks, and months of a particular year, or giving particular seasonal information.
- A list or register of events (appointments or social events or court cases etc.
- A system by which the beginning, length, and subdivisions of the year are fixed.
- A system of timekeeping that defines the beginning and length and divisions of the year.
- A list of days or events of a specified kind.
- A tabular array of the days (usually for one year.
