- *Each of a set of graduations on an instrument.*



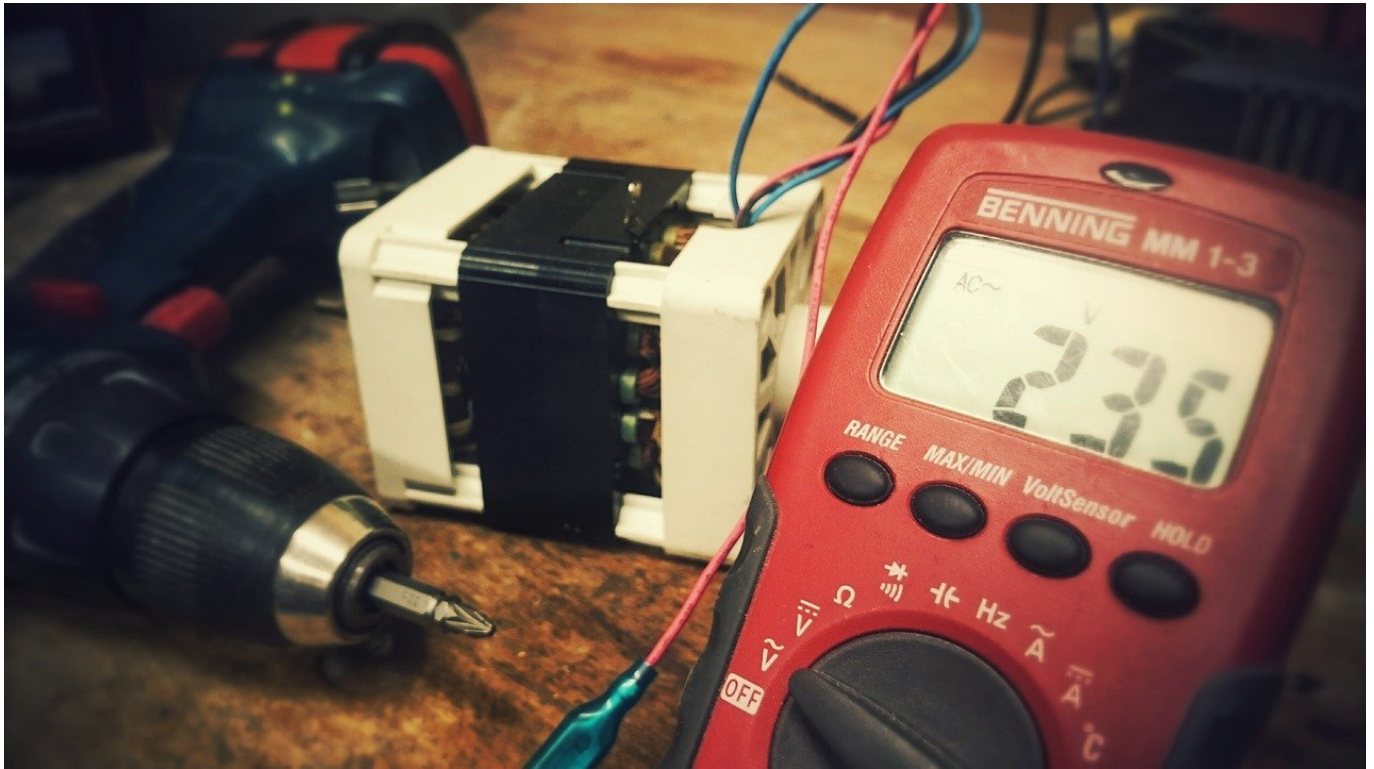
## Synonyms of "Calibration" as a noun (5 Words)

<b>measuring system</b>	A basis for comparison; a reference point against which other things can be evaluated.
<b><a href="#">register</a></b>	A cashbox with an adding machine to register transactions used in shops to add up the bill. <i>I had signed the <b>register</b> with my new name.</i>
<b>standardisation</b>	The imposition of standards or regulations.
<b>standardization</b>	The imposition of standards or regulations. <i>Laboratory <b>standardizations</b> and techniques.</i>
<b>system of measurement</b>	A sample of matter in which substances in different phases are in equilibrium.



## Usage Examples of "Calibration" as a noun

- *He peered at the calibrations on the rule.*
- *The measuring devices require calibration.*
- *The thermometer needed calibration.*



## Associations of "Calibration" (30 Words)

<b>airspeed</b>	The speed of an aircraft relative to the air through which it is moving.
<b>ammeter</b>	A meter that measures the flow of electrical current in amperes.
<b>amount</b>	Be tantamount or equivalent to. <i>Their actions <b>amounted</b> to a conspiracy.</i>
<b>anemometer</b>	An instrument for measuring the speed of the wind, or of any current of gas.
<b><u>benchmark</u></b>	Give particular results during a benchmark test. <i>His painting sets the <b>benchmark</b> of quality.</i>
<b><u>count</u></b>	The total number counted. <i>There was a moderate increase in the white cell <b>count</b> in both patients.</i>
<b>dashboard</b>	A graphical summary of various pieces of important information, typically used to give an overview of a business. <i>Scott looked at the clock on the <b>dashboard</b>.</i>
<b>dial</b>	Operate a dial to select a telephone number. <i>He must be one of the new batch I haven't seen his <b>dial</b> before.</i>

<b>digital</b>	Relating to using or storing data or information in the form of digital signals. <i><b>Digital</b> computer.</i>
<b>fathomable</b>	Capable of being sounded or measured for depth. Place a bet on.
<b>gage</b>	<i>A guide sent to them by the headman of this place <b>gaged</b> his life as a forfeit if he failed.</i>
<b>gauge</b>	Measure the dimensions of an object with a gauge. <i><b>Gauge</b> the instruments.</i>
<b>magnitude</b>	A number assigned to the ratio of two quantities two quantities are of the same order of magnitude if one is less than 10 times as large as the other the number of magnitudes that the quantities differ is specified to within a power of 10. <i>A star of the fifth <b>magnitude</b>.</i>
<b>measurable</b>	Able to be measured. <i>A <b>measurable</b> figure in literature.</i>
<b>measure</b>	Measuring instrument having a sequence of marks at regular intervals used as a reference in making measurements. <i>Cost cutting <b>measures</b>.</i>
<b>measurement</b>	The action of measuring something. <i>A telescope with which precise <b>measurements</b> can be made.</i>
<b>meter</b>	Measure with a meter. <i><b>Meter</b> the flow of water.</i>
<b>metric</b>	Relating to or using the metric system. <i>The external structure of space time is described by the Schwarzschild <b>metric</b>.</i>
<b>mileage</b>	A travel allowance at a given rate per mile traveled. <i>The <b>mileage</b> rate will be 30p per mile.</i>
<b>miter</b>	Bevel the edges of to make a miter joint. <i>He covered the <b>miter</b> with glue before making the joint.</i>
<b>odometer</b>	An instrument for measuring the distance travelled by a wheeled vehicle.
<b>photometer</b>	Measuring instrument for measuring the luminous intensity of a source by comparing it (visually or photoelectrically) with a standard source.
<b>quantifiable</b>	Capable of being quantified. <i><b>Quantifiable</b> data.</i>
<b>quantity</b>	The figure or symbol representing a quantity. <i>The <b>quantity</b> and quality of the fruit can be controlled.</i>

**speedometer** A meter fixed to a vehicle that measures and displays its speed.

**tachometer** Measuring instrument for indicating speed of rotation.

**thermometer** An instrument for measuring and indicating temperature, typically one consisting of a narrow, hermetically sealed glass tube marked with graduations and having at one end a bulb containing mercury or alcohol which extends along the tube as it expands.

**velocity** Distance travelled per unit time.  
*The tank shot backwards at an incredible **velocity**.*

**voltmeter** Meter that measures the potential difference between two points.

**weight** Assign a handicap weight to a horse.  
*The balance of power is **weighted** in favour of the government.*
