- *Each of a set of graduations on an instrument.*



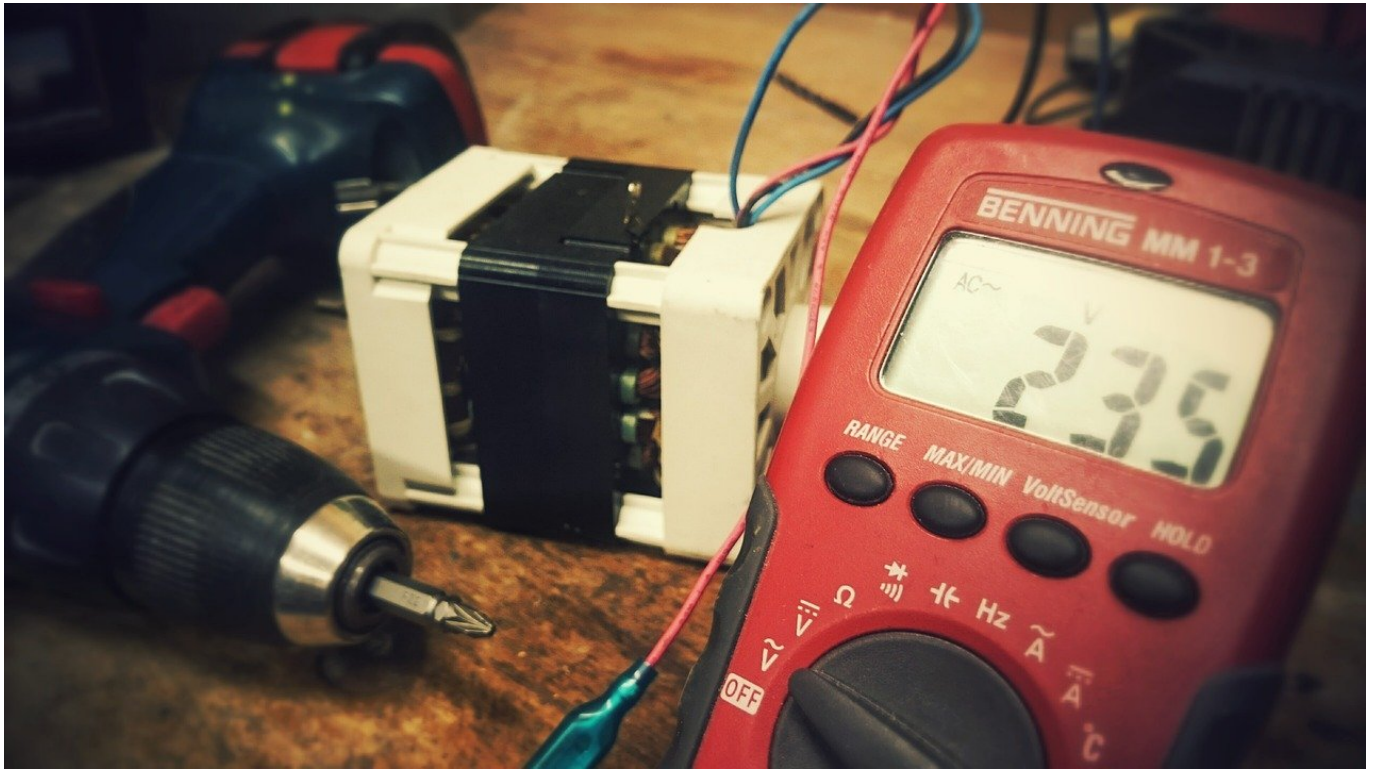
Synonyms of "Calibration" as a noun (5 Words)

measuring system	A basis for comparison; a reference point against which other things can be evaluated.
register	A cashbox with an adding machine to register transactions used in shops to add up the bill. <i>I had signed the register with my new name.</i>
standardisation	The imposition of standards or regulations.
standardization	The imposition of standards or regulations. <i>Laboratory standardizations and techniques.</i>
system of measurement	A sample of matter in which substances in different phases are in equilibrium.



Usage Examples of "Calibration" as a noun

- *He peered at the calibrations on the rule.*
- *The measuring devices require calibration.*
- *The thermometer needed calibration.*



Associations of "Calibration" (30 Words)

airspeed	The speed of an aircraft relative to the air through which it is moving.
ammeter	A meter that measures the flow of electrical current in amperes.
amount	Be tantamount or equivalent to. <i>Their actions amounted to a conspiracy.</i>
anemometer	An instrument for measuring the speed of the wind, or of any current of gas.
<u>benchmark</u>	Give particular results during a benchmark test. <i>His painting sets the benchmark of quality.</i>
<u>count</u>	The total number counted. <i>There was a moderate increase in the white cell count in both patients.</i>
dashboard	A graphical summary of various pieces of important information, typically used to give an overview of a business. <i>Scott looked at the clock on the dashboard.</i>
dial	Operate a dial to select a telephone number. <i>He must be one of the new batch I haven't seen his dial before.</i>

digital	Relating to using or storing data or information in the form of digital signals. <i>Digital computer.</i>
fathomable	Capable of being sounded or measured for depth. Place a bet on.
gage	<i>A guide sent to them by the headman of this place gaged his life as a forfeit if he failed.</i>
gauge	Measure the dimensions of an object with a gauge. <i>Gauge the instruments.</i>
magnitude	A number assigned to the ratio of two quantities two quantities are of the same order of magnitude if one is less than 10 times as large as the other the number of magnitudes that the quantities differ is specified to within a power of 10. <i>A star of the fifth magnitude.</i>
measurable	Able to be measured. <i>A measurable figure in literature.</i>
measure	Measuring instrument having a sequence of marks at regular intervals used as a reference in making measurements. <i>Cost cutting measures.</i>
measurement	The action of measuring something. <i>A telescope with which precise measurements can be made.</i>
meter	Measure with a meter. <i>Meter the flow of water.</i>
metric	Relating to or using the metric system. <i>The external structure of space time is described by the Schwarzschild metric.</i>
mileage	A travel allowance at a given rate per mile traveled. <i>The mileage rate will be 30p per mile.</i>
miter	Bevel the edges of to make a miter joint. <i>He covered the miter with glue before making the joint.</i>
odometer	An instrument for measuring the distance travelled by a wheeled vehicle.
photometer	Measuring instrument for measuring the luminous intensity of a source by comparing it (visually or photoelectrically) with a standard source.
quantifiable	Capable of being quantified. <i>Quantifiable data.</i>
quantity	The figure or symbol representing a quantity. <i>The quantity and quality of the fruit can be controlled.</i>

speedometer A meter fixed to a vehicle that measures and displays its speed.

tachometer Measuring instrument for indicating speed of rotation.

thermometer An instrument for measuring and indicating temperature, typically one consisting of a narrow, hermetically sealed glass tube marked with graduations and having at one end a bulb containing mercury or alcohol which extends along the tube as it expands.

velocity Distance travelled per unit time.
*The tank shot backwards at an incredible **velocity**.*

voltmeter Meter that measures the potential difference between two points.

weight Assign a handicap weight to a horse.
*The balance of power is **weighted** in favour of the government.*
