Associations of "Call to action" (30 Words)

arbitrer	Someone chosen to judge and decide a disputed issue. <i>An arbitrer of taste.</i>
beckon	Summon someone by beckoning to them. <i>He beckoned Duncan to follow.</i>
caller	A racing or sports commentator. <i>There were so many callers that he finally disconnected the telephone.</i>
captive	Giving or marked by complete attention to- Walter de la Mare. <i>The policeman put a pair of handcuffs on the captive.</i>
chime	A percussion instrument consisting of a set of tuned bells that are struck with a hammer; used as an orchestral instrument. <i>Bells and gongs chimed.</i>
convoke	Call together or summon (an assembly or meeting). <i>She sent messages convoking a Council of Ministers.</i>
disconnect	An instance of disconnecting or being disconnected. <i>I phoned them in Edinburgh but we got disconnected.</i>
doorbell	A push button at an outer door that gives a ringing or buzzing signal when pushed. <i>Charlotte rang the doorbell.</i>
electronically	By electronic means. <i>The information can be recorded electronically.</i>
elicit	Call forth (emotions, feelings, and responses). <i>The work elicited enormous public interest.</i>
evoke	Evoke or provoke to appear or occur. <i>The sight evoked pleasant memories of his childhood.</i>
extradition	The action of extraditing a person accused or convicted of a crime. <i>Emergency extraditions.</i>

intercom	A communication system linking different rooms within a building or ship etc. <i>A special intercom linking the theatre with the pathology lab.</i>
invite	Invite someone to one's house. <i>Invite criticism.</i>
<u>invoke</u>	Summon into action or bring into existence, often as if by magic. <i>He invoked the law that would save him.</i>
joystick	A lever that can be moved in several directions to control the movement of an image on a computer or similar display screen.
<u>mobilize</u>	Bring (resources) into use for a particular purpose. <i>The government mobilized regular forces reservists and militia.</i>
muster	A gathering of military personnel for duty. <i>The cavalymen mustered beside the other regiments.</i>
paging	The system of numbering pages. <i>The public address system in the hospital was used for paging.</i>
<u>phone</u>	Get or try to get into communication with someone by telephone. <i>He phoned her at work.</i>
<u>reinstate</u>	Restore to the previous state or rank. <i>The union threatened strike action if Owen was not reinstated.</i>
repatriate	A person who has been repatriated. <i>Foreign firms would be permitted to repatriate all profits.</i>
ring	The sound of a bell ringing. <i>Ring birds.</i>
<u>summon</u>	Call in an official matter, such as to attend court. <i>Summon a lawyer.</i>
summons	Serve someone with a summons. <i>He has been summonsed to appear in court next month.</i>
<u>telephone</u>	Make a telephone call. <i>He telephoned his wife at 9 30.</i>
telephony	Transmitting speech at a distance. <i>Telephony and data transmission.</i>
tribunal	A court of justice. <i>An industrial tribunal ruled that he was unfairly dismissed.</i>
warrant	A document that entitles the holder to receive goods, money, or services. <i>Warrant bonds.</i>

writ

A form of written command in the name of a court or other legal authority to act or abstain from acting in a particular way.

*The two reinstated officers issued a **writ** for libel against the applicants.*
