| <a href="#">arbiter</a> | Someone chosen to judge and decide a disputed issue.<br><i>An <b>arbiter</b> of taste.</i>   |
| <a href="#">beckon</a>  | Summon someone by beckoning to them.<br><i>He <b>beckoned</b> Duncan to follow.</i>  |
| caller                  | A racing or sports commentator.<br><i>There were so many <b>callers</b> that he finally disconnected the telephone.</i>  |
| <a href="#">captive</a> | Giving or marked by complete attention to- Walter de la Mare.<br><i>The policeman put a pair of handcuffs on the <b>captive</b>.</i>                                 |
| chime                   | A percussion instrument consisting of a set of tuned bells that are struck with a hammer; used as an orchestral instrument.<br><i>Bells and gongs <b>chimed</b>.</i> |
| convoke                 | Call together or summon (an assembly or meeting).<br><i>She sent messages convoking a Council of Ministers.</i>  |
| disconnect              | An instance of disconnecting or being disconnected.<br><i>I phoned them in Edinburgh but we got <b>disconnected</b>.</i>   |
| doorbell                | A push button at an outer door that gives a ringing or buzzing signal when pushed.<br><i>Charlotte rang the <b>doorbell</b>.</i>                                     |
| electronically          | By electronic means.<br><i>The information can be recorded <b>electronically</b>.</i>  |
| <a href="#">elicit</a>  | Call forth (emotions, feelings, and responses).<br><i>The work <b>elicited</b> enormous public interest.</i>   |
| <a href="#">evoke</a>   | Evoke or provoke to appear or occur.<br><i>The sight <b>evoked</b> pleasant memories of his childhood.</i>   |
| extradition             | The action of extraditing a person accused or convicted of a crime.<br><i>Emergency <b>extraditions</b>.</i>   |

| <b>intercom</b>         | A communication system linking different rooms within a building or ship etc.<br><i>A special <b>intercom</b> linking the theatre with the pathology lab.</i> |
| <b>invite</b>           | Invite someone to one's house.<br><i><b>Invite</b> criticism.</i>   |
| <b><u>invoke</u></b>    | Summon into action or bring into existence, often as if by magic.<br><i>He <b>invoked</b> the law that would save him.</i>                                    |
| <b>joystick</b>         | A lever that can be moved in several directions to control the movement of an image on a computer or similar display screen.                                  |
| <b><u>mobilize</u></b>  | Bring (resources) into use for a particular purpose.<br><i>The government <b>mobilized</b> regular forces reservists and militia.</i>                         |
| <b>muster</b>           | A gathering of military personnel for duty.<br><i>The cavalymen <b>mustered</b> beside the other regiments.</i>   |
| <b>paging</b>           | The system of numbering pages.<br><i>The public address system in the hospital was used for <b>paging</b>.</i>  |
| <b><u>phone</u></b>     | Get or try to get into communication with someone by telephone.<br><i>He <b>phoned</b> her at work.</i>   |
| <b><u>reinstate</u></b> | Restore to the previous state or rank.<br><i>The union threatened strike action if Owen was not <b>reinstated</b>.</i>  |
| <b>repatriate</b>       | A person who has been repatriated.<br><i>Foreign firms would be permitted to <b>repatriate</b> all profits.</i>   |
| <b>ring</b>             | The sound of a bell ringing.<br><i><b>Ring</b> birds.</i>   |
| <b><u>summon</u></b>    | Call in an official matter, such as to attend court.<br><i><b>Summon</b> a lawyer.</i>  |
| <b>summons</b>          | Serve someone with a summons.<br><i>He has been <b>summonsed</b> to appear in court next month.</i>   |
| <b><u>telephone</u></b> | Make a telephone call.<br><i>He <b>telephoned</b> his wife at 9 30.</i>   |
| <b>telephony</b>        | Transmitting speech at a distance.<br><i><b>Telephony</b> and data transmission.</i>  |
| <b>tribunal</b>         | A court of justice.<br><i>An industrial <b>tribunal</b> ruled that he was unfairly dismissed.</i>   |
| <b>warrant</b>          | A document that entitles the holder to receive goods, money, or services.<br><i><b>Warrant</b> bonds.</i>   |

**writ**

A form of written command in the name of a court or other legal authority to act or abstain from acting in a particular way.

*The two reinstated officers issued a **writ** for libel against the applicants.*
