Associations of "Calm down" (30 Words)

<u>calmness</u>	Steadiness of mind under stress. <i>Those who worked with him refer time and again to his calmness under pressure.</i>
composed	Serenely self-possessed and free from agitation especially in times of stress. <i>A very talented and composed young player.</i>
composure	The state or feeling of being calm and in control of oneself. <i>She was struggling to regain her composure.</i>
coolheaded	Marked by calm self-control (especially in trying circumstances); unemotional. <i>Stayed coolheaded in the crisis.</i>
equanimity	Steadiness of mind under stress. <i>He accepted their problems with composure and she with equanimity.</i>
halcyon	A tropical Asian and African kingfisher with brightly coloured plumage. <i>A halcyon atmosphere.</i>
<u>idyllic</u>	Excellent and delightful in all respects. <i>An idyllic spot for a picnic.</i>
<u>imperturbable</u>	Unable to be upset or excited; calm. <i>Hitherto imperturbable he now showed signs of alarm.</i>
noiseless	Making no sound- Shakespeare. <i>Th inaudible and noiseless foot of time.</i>
nonviolence	Peaceful resistance to a government by fasting or refusing to cooperate.
nonviolent	Achieved without bloodshed.
pacific	A steam locomotive of 4-6-2 wheel arrangement. <i>A pacific gesture.</i>
peaceful	Peacefully resistant in response to injustice. <i>Peaceful times.</i>

peacetime	A period of time during which there is no war. <i>In peacetime regiments were billeted upon towns and villages.</i>
<u>placid</u>	Free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>Not everyone shared his placid temperament.</i>
quiescent	Marked by a state of tranquil repose. <i>A quiescent tumor.</i>
quiet	With little or no activity or no agitation quiet is a nonstandard variant for quietly. <i>The room was dark and quiet.</i>
quietude	A state of stillness, calmness, and quiet in a person or place. <i>It highlights her quietude and wise passivity.</i>
<u>restful</u>	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>The rooms were cool and restful.</i>
reticence	The quality of being reticent; reserve. <i>The traditional emotional reticence of the British.</i>
<u>sedate</u>	Characterized by dignity and propriety. <i>A quiet sedate nature.</i>
<u>serene</u>	An expanse of clear sky or calm sea. <i>Not a cloud obscured the deep serene.</i>
<u>serenity</u>	A disposition free from stress or emotion. <i>An oasis of serenity amidst the bustling city.</i>
still	Make or become still quieten. <i>Film stills.</i>
<u>stillness</u>	Calmness without winds. <i>An eerie stillness engulfed the camp.</i>
<u>tranquil</u>	Free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>A lake of tranquil blue water reflecting a tranquil blue sky.</i>
<u>tranquility</u>	A disposition free from stress or emotion.
tranquilize	Cause to be calm or quiet as by administering a sedative to.
tranquillity	An untroubled state; free from disturbances. <i>Passing cars are the only noise that disturbs the tranquillity of rural life.</i>
unflappable	Not easily perturbed or excited or upset; marked by extreme calm and composure. <i>Self contained unflappable Glaswegian common sense.</i>
