- *Equipment for taking photographs (usually consisting of a lightproof box with a lens at one end and light-sensitive film at the other.*

- photographic camera** Television equipment consisting of a lens system that focuses an image on a photosensitive mosaic that is scanned by an electron beam.
- television camera** Broadcasting visual images of stationary or moving objects - Ernie Kovacs.
- tv camera** An electronic device that receives television signals and displays them on a screen.

- audio** The audible part of a transmitted signal.
Audio equipment.

- button** Fasten the buttons of a garment being worn by someone.

- camcorder** A portable television camera and videocassette recorder.
- cameraman** A photographer who operates a movie camera.

cinematic	Having qualities characteristic of films. <i>The cinematic feel of their video.</i>
click	Produce a click. <i>She heard the click of the door.</i>
clip	Fasten or be fastened with a clip or clips. <i>A gilt clip fastened her hair.</i>
daguerreotype	A photograph made by an early photographic process; the image was produced on a silver plate sensitized to iodine and developed in mercury vapor.
enlarger	Photographic equipment consisting of an optical projector used to enlarge a photograph.
film	Make a film or photograph of something. <i>She glowered at the television crew who were filming them.</i>
flick	Remove with a flick of the hand. <i>The driver flicked his whip and the cab moved off.</i>
microphone	An instrument for converting sound waves into electrical energy variations which may then be amplified, transmitted, or recorded.
movie	Films generally or the film industry. <i>They went to a movie every Saturday night.</i>
photograph	Take a photograph of. <i>She has photographed all of the major ballet companies worldwide.</i>
photographer	A person who takes photographs, especially as a job. <i>A freelance press photographer.</i>
photography	The process of producing images of objects on photosensitive surfaces.
pixel	A minute area of illumination on a display screen, one of many from which an image is composed. <i>The greater the number of pixels per inch the greater the resolution.</i>
playback	A pre-recorded musical soundtrack mimed to by an actor. <i>We listened to several playbacks in the control room.</i>
preview	A trailer for a film. <i>In our preview of children s books we select some forthcoming titles.</i>
projector	An optical device for projecting a beam of light. <i>He was a tobacco grower and projector.</i>
recorder	Someone responsible for keeping records. <i>I was talking away into my recorder.</i>
screen	The data or images displayed on a computer screen. <i>A huge movie screen.</i>

screening	Fabric of metal or plastic mesh. <i>Filmgoers were shut out in droves from the film s many screenings in Cannes.</i>
studio	A studio flat. <i>The music department provided studios for their students.</i>
tape	Seal or mark off an area or thing with tape. <i>The several recordings were combined on a master tape.</i>
theater	A region in which active military operations are in progress. <i>He served in the Vietnam theater for three years.</i>
theatrical	A professional actor or actress. <i>A boarding house that catered for theatricals.</i>
tripod	A three-legged stand for supporting a camera or other apparatus.
video	A recording of moving visual images made digitally or on videotape. <i>A pop video.</i>
