- *A device for recording visual images in the form of photographs, film, or video signals.*
- *Equipment for taking photographs (usually consisting of a lightproof box with a lens at one end and light-sensitive film at the other.*

<b>photographic camera</b>	Television equipment consisting of a lens system that focuses an image on a photosensitive mosaic that is scanned by an electron beam.
<b>television camera</b>	Broadcasting visual images of stationary or moving objects - Ernie Kovacs.
<b>tv camera</b>	An electronic device that receives television signals and displays them on a screen.

## Associations of "Camera" (30 Words)

### audio

The audible part of a transmitted signal.  
***Audio** equipment.*

### blockbuster

An unusually successful hit with widespread popularity and huge sales (especially a movie or play or recording or novel).  
*A **blockbuster** film.*

### **button**

Fasten the buttons of a garment being worn by someone.  
*I **buttoned** my shirt and knotted my tie.*

### **camcorder**

A portable television camera and videocassette recorder.

### **cameraman**

A photographer who operates a movie camera.



<b>cinematic</b>	Having qualities characteristic of films. <i>The <b>cinematic</b> feel of their video.</i>
<u><b>click</b></u>	Produce a click. <i>She heard the <b>click</b> of the door.</i>
<u><b>clip</b></u>	Fasten or be fastened with a clip or clips. <i>A gilt <b>clip</b> fastened her hair.</i>
<b>daguerreotype</b>	A photograph made by an early photographic process; the image was produced on a silver plate sensitized to iodine and developed in mercury vapor.
<b>enlarger</b>	Photographic equipment consisting of an optical projector used to enlarge a photograph.
<b>film</b>	Make a film or photograph of something. <i>She glowered at the television crew who were <b>filming</b> them.</i>
<b>flick</b>	Remove with a flick of the hand. <i>The driver <b>flicked</b> his whip and the cab moved off.</i>
<b>microphone</b>	An instrument for converting sound waves into electrical energy variations which may then be amplified, transmitted, or recorded.
<b>movie</b>	Films generally or the film industry. <i>They went to a <b>movie</b> every Saturday night.</i>
<b>photograph</b>	Take a photograph of. <i>She has <b>photographed</b> all of the major ballet companies worldwide.</i>
<b>photographer</b>	A person who takes photographs, especially as a job. <i>A freelance press <b>photographer</b>.</i>
<b>photography</b>	The process of producing images of objects on photosensitive surfaces.
<b>pixel</b>	A minute area of illumination on a display screen, one of many from which an image is composed. <i>The greater the number of <b>pixels</b> per inch the greater the resolution.</i>
<b>playback</b>	A pre-recorded musical soundtrack mimed to by an actor. <i>We listened to several <b>playbacks</b> in the control room.</i>
<b>preview</b>	A trailer for a film. <i>In our <b>preview</b> of children s books we select some forthcoming titles.</i>
<b>projector</b>	An optical device for projecting a beam of light. <i>He was a tobacco grower and <b>projector</b>.</i>
<b>recorder</b>	Someone responsible for keeping records. <i>I was talking away into my <b>recorder</b>.</i>
<u><b>screen</b></u>	The data or images displayed on a computer screen. <i>A huge movie <b>screen</b>.</i>

screening

Fabric of metal or plastic mesh.

*Filmgoers were shut out in droves from the film s many **screenings** in Cannes.*

studio

A studio flat.

*The music department provided **studios** for their students.*

tape

Seal or mark off an area or thing with tape.

*The several recordings were combined on a master **tape**.*

theater

A region in which active military operations are in progress.

*He served in the Vietnam **theater** for three years.*

**theatrical**

A professional actor or actress.

*A boarding house that catered for **theatricals**.*

**tripod**

A three-legged stand for supporting a camera or other apparatus.

**video**

A recording of moving visual images made digitally or on videotape.

*A pop **video**.*
