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<u>Associations of "Campus" (30 Words)</u>

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<u>absenteeism</u>	The practice of regularly staying away from work or school without good reason. High levels of <b>absenteeism</b> caused by low job motivation.
<u>academy</u>	A school for special training. A police <b>academy</b> .
attendance	The number of people that are present. <i>Attendance</i> was up by 50 per cent.
bursar	A student who holds a bursary.
college	The teaching staff and students of a college considered collectively. <i>Colleges of further education.</i>
diploma	A certificate awarded by an educational establishment to show that someone has successfully completed a course of study.
<u>dorm</u>	A dormitory.
<u>educate</u>	Give intellectual, moral, and social instruction to (someone), typically at a school or university. We must <b>educate</b> our youngsters better.
<u>educator</u>	Someone who educates young people. The perspective of a professional <b>educator</b> .
enrol	Recruit (someone) to perform a service. <i>The endowment of religious houses cannot be measured simply by the</i> <i>licences</i> <b>enrol</b> led in chancery.
<u>enrollment</u>	The act of enrolling.
grad	A person who has received a degree from a school (high school or college or university.
graduation	An academic exercise in which diplomas are conferred. The ruler had 16 <b>graduation</b> s per inch.
headmaster	Presiding officer of a school.



homeroom	A classroom in which a group of students assembles daily with the same teacher before dispersing to other classes.
matriculate	A person who has matriculated. They had recently <b>matriculate</b> d as undergraduates at Jesus College.
pedagogics	The principles and methods of instruction.
pedagogy	The method and practice of teaching, especially as an academic subject or theoretical concept. <b>Pedagogy</b> is recognized as an important profession.
polytechnic	An institution of higher education offering courses at degree level or below, especially in vocational subjects.
pupil	A young person attending school (up through senior high school. They are former <b>pupil</b> s of the school.
<u>schooling</u>	The process of being formally educated at a school. <i>Schooling fences.</i>
schoolmaster	An experienced horse that is used to train or give confidence to inexperienced riders or horses.
semester	Half a year; a period of 6 months. The opening week of Harvard s autumn <b>semester</b> .
studying	Reading carefully with intent to remember.
teach	Work as a teacher. I ll <b>teach</b> you to throw rocks at my windows.
teaching	The activities of educating or instructing; activities that impart knowledge or skill. <i>He prepared for <b>teaching</b> while still in college.</i>
<u>trainee</u>	A person undergoing training for a particular job or profession. <i>Trainee</i> solicitors.
undergraduate	Denoting or relating to an undergraduate. <b>Undergraduate</b> students.
<u>university</u>	The body of faculty and students at a university. <i>His daughter is at <b>university</b>.</i>
valedictorian	(in North America) a student who delivers the valedictory at a graduation ceremony.
