| absenteeism | The practice of regularly staying away from work or school without good reason. <i>High levels of absenteeism caused by low job motivation.</i> |
| academy | A school for special training. <i>A police academy.</i> |
| attendance | The number of people that are present. <i>Attendance was up by 50 per cent.</i> |
| bursar | A student who holds a bursary. |
| college | The teaching staff and students of a college considered collectively. <i>Colleges of further education.</i> |
| diploma | A certificate awarded by an educational establishment to show that someone has successfully completed a course of study. |
| dorm | A dormitory. |
| educate | Give intellectual, moral, and social instruction to (someone), typically at a school or university. <i>We must educate our youngsters better.</i> |
| educator | Someone who educates young people. <i>The perspective of a professional educator.</i> |
| enrol | Recruit (someone) to perform a service. <i>The endowment of religious houses cannot be measured simply by the licences enrolled in chancery.</i> |
| enrollment | The act of enrolling. |
| grad | A person who has received a degree from a school (high school or college or university). |
| graduation | An academic exercise in which diplomas are conferred. <i>The ruler had 16 graduations per inch.</i> |
| headmaster | Presiding officer of a school. |

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| homeroom | A classroom in which a group of students assembles daily with the same teacher before dispersing to other classes. |
| matriculate | A person who has matriculated. <i>They had recently matriculated as undergraduates at Jesus College.</i> |
| pedagogics | The principles and methods of instruction. |
| pedagogy | The method and practice of teaching, especially as an academic subject or theoretical concept. <i>Pedagogy is recognized as an important profession.</i> |
| polytechnic | An institution of higher education offering courses at degree level or below, especially in vocational subjects. |
| pupil | A young person attending school (up through senior high school). <i>They are former pupils of the school.</i> |
| <u>schooling</u> | The process of being formally educated at a school. <i>Schooling fences.</i> |
| schoolmaster | An experienced horse that is used to train or give confidence to inexperienced riders or horses. |
| semester | Half a year; a period of 6 months. <i>The opening week of Harvard's autumn semester.</i> |
| studying | Reading carefully with intent to remember. |
| teach | Work as a teacher. <i>I'll teach you to throw rocks at my windows.</i> |
| teaching | The activities of educating or instructing; activities that impart knowledge or skill. <i>He prepared for teaching while still in college.</i> |
| <u>trainee</u> | A person undergoing training for a particular job or profession. <i>Trainee solicitors.</i> |
| undergraduate | Denoting or relating to an undergraduate. <i>Undergraduate students.</i> |
| <u>university</u> | The body of faculty and students at a university. <i>His daughter is at university.</i> |
| valedictorian | (in North America) a student who delivers the valedictory at a graduation ceremony. |
