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## Associations of "Campus" (30 Words)

<a href="#">absenteeism</a>	The practice of regularly staying away from work or school without good reason. <i>High levels of <b>absenteeism</b> caused by low job motivation.</i>
<a href="#">academy</a>	A school for special training. <i>A police <b>academy</b>.</i>
<b>attendance</b>	The number of people that are present. <i><b>Attendance</b> was up by 50 per cent.</i>
<b>bursar</b>	A student who holds a bursary.
<b>college</b>	The teaching staff and students of a college considered collectively. <i><b>Colleges</b> of further education.</i>
<b>diploma</b>	A certificate awarded by an educational establishment to show that someone has successfully completed a course of study.
<a href="#">dorm</a>	A dormitory.
<a href="#">educate</a>	Give intellectual, moral, and social instruction to (someone), typically at a school or university. <i>We must <b>educate</b> our youngsters better.</i>
<a href="#">educator</a>	Someone who educates young people. <i>The perspective of a professional <b>educator</b>.</i>
<b>enrol</b>	Recruit (someone) to perform a service. <i>The endowment of religious houses cannot be measured simply by the licences <b>enrolled</b> in chancery.</i>
<a href="#">enrollment</a>	The act of enrolling.
<b>grad</b>	A person who has received a degree from a school (high school or college or university).
<b>graduation</b>	An academic exercise in which diplomas are conferred. <i>The ruler had 16 <b>graduations</b> per inch.</i>
<b>headmaster</b>	Presiding officer of a school.

<b>homeroom</b>	A classroom in which a group of students assembles daily with the same teacher before dispersing to other classes.
<b>matriculate</b>	A person who has matriculated. <i>They had recently <b>matriculated</b> as undergraduates at Jesus College.</i>
<b>pedagogics</b>	The principles and methods of instruction.
<b>pedagogy</b>	The method and practice of teaching, especially as an academic subject or theoretical concept. <i><b>Pedagogy</b> is recognized as an important profession.</i>
<b>polytechnic</b>	An institution of higher education offering courses at degree level or below, especially in vocational subjects.
<b>pupil</b>	A young person attending school (up through senior high school). <i>They are former <b>pupils</b> of the school.</i>
<b><u>schooling</u></b>	The process of being formally educated at a school. <i><b>Schooling</b> fences.</i>
<b>schoolmaster</b>	An experienced horse that is used to train or give confidence to inexperienced riders or horses.
<b>semester</b>	Half a year; a period of 6 months. <i>The opening week of Harvard's autumn <b>semester</b>.</i>
<b>studying</b>	Reading carefully with intent to remember.
<b>teach</b>	Work as a teacher. <i>I'll <b>teach</b> you to throw rocks at my windows.</i>
<b>teaching</b>	The activities of educating or instructing; activities that impart knowledge or skill. <i>He prepared for <b>teaching</b> while still in college.</i>
<b><u>trainee</u></b>	A person undergoing training for a particular job or profession. <i><b>Trainee</b> solicitors.</i>
<b>undergraduate</b>	Denoting or relating to an undergraduate. <i><b>Undergraduate</b> students.</i>
<b><u>university</u></b>	The body of faculty and students at a university. <i>His daughter is at <b>university</b>.</i>
<b>valedictorian</b>	(in North America) a student who delivers the valedictory at a graduation ceremony.
