Past Tense	<b>canned</b>
Present Participle -	
Past Participle	<b>canned</b>

## Conjugate Can

### Can in Present Simple (Indefinite) Tense

<b>Singular</b>	<b>Plural</b>
-----------------	---------------

I <b>can</b>	We <b>can</b>
You <b>can</b>	You <b>can</b>
He/She/It <b>can</b>	They <b>can</b>

## **Can in Present Continuous (Progressive) Tense**

<b>Singular</b>	<b>Plural</b>
-----------------	---------------

I <b>am -</b>	We <b>are -</b>
You <b>are -</b>	You <b>are -</b>
He/She/It <b>is -</b>	They <b>are -</b>

## **Can in Present Perfect Tense**

<b>Singular</b>	<b>Plural</b>
-----------------	---------------

I <b>have canned</b>	We <b>have canned</b>
You <b>have canned</b>	You <b>have canned</b>
He/She/It <b>has canned</b>	They <b>have canned</b>

## **Can in Present Perfect Continuous Tense**

<b>Singular</b>	<b>Plural</b>
-----------------	---------------

I <b>have been -</b>	We <b>have been -</b>
You <b>have been -</b>	You <b>have been -</b>
He/She/It <b>has been -</b>	They <b>have been -</b>

## **Can in Past Simple (Indefinite) Tense**

<b>Singular</b>	<b>Plural</b>
-----------------	---------------

I <b>canned</b>	We <b>canned</b>
You <b>canned</b>	You <b>canned</b>
He/She/It <b>canned</b>	They <b>canned</b>

## **Can in Past Continuous (Progressive) Tense**

<b>Singular</b>	<b>Plural</b>
-----------------	---------------

I <b>was</b> -	We <b>were</b> -
You <b>were</b> -	You <b>were</b> -
He/She/It <b>was</b> -	They <b>were</b> -

### **Can in Past Perfect Tense**

<b>Singular</b>	<b>Plural</b>
-----------------	---------------

I <b>had canned</b>	We <b>had canned</b>
You <b>had canned</b>	You <b>had canned</b>
He/She/It <b>had canned</b>	They <b>had canned</b>

### **Can in Past Perfect Continuous Tense**

<b>Singular</b>	<b>Plural</b>
-----------------	---------------

I <b>had been</b> -	We <b>had been</b> -
You <b>had been</b> -	You <b>had been</b> -
He/She/It <b>had been</b> -	They <b>had been</b> -

### **Can in Future Simple (Indefinite) Tense**

<b>Singular</b>	<b>Plural</b>
-----------------	---------------

I <b>will can</b>	We <b>will can</b>
You <b>will can</b>	You <b>will can</b>
He/She/It <b>will can</b>	They <b>will can</b>

### **Can in Future Continuous (Progressive) Tense**

<b>Singular</b>	<b>Plural</b>
-----------------	---------------

I <b>will be</b> -	We <b>will be</b> -
You <b>will be</b> -	You <b>will be</b> -
He/She/It <b>will be</b> -	They <b>will be</b> -

**I will have canned**

**We will have canned**

**You will have canned**

**You will have canned**

**He/She/It will have canned**

**They will have canned**

**Singular**

**Plural**

**I will have been -**

**We will have been -**

**You will have been -**

**You will have been -**

**He/She/It will have been -**

**They will have been -**
