directness	The quality of being plain and straightforward. <i>I like the simplicity and directness of the image.</i>
fair-mindedness	Ability to make judgments free from discrimination or dishonesty.
fairness	Impartial and just treatment or behaviour without favouritism or discrimination. <i>Part of my role is to ensure fairness to all parties.</i>
forthrightness	The quality of being honest and straightforward in attitude and speech.

frankness A member of the ancient Germanic peoples who spread from the Rhine into the Roman Empire in the 4th century.
*Lisa spoke with disarming **frankness** about the accident.*

candid Openly straightforward and direct without reserve or secretiveness.
*His **candid** eyes.*

candour The quality of being open and honest; frankness.
*A man of refreshing **candour**.*

childlike Exhibiting childlike simplicity and credulity.
***Childlike** trust.*

clarity The quality of being certain or definite.
*The **clarity** of the picture.*

directness Trueness of course toward a goal.
*Despite the **directness** of the route the old road was terribly difficult.*

easiness The quality of being easy in behavior or style.
*A natural **easiness** of manner.*

forthrightness The quality of being honest and straightforward in attitude and speech.

frank Stamp with a postmark to indicate date and time of mailing.
***Frank** enjoyment.*

friendliness A friendly disposition.
*I was overwhelmed by the **friendliness** of the people here.*

guileless Devoid of guile; innocent and without deception.
*His face once so open and **guileless**.*

honest Morally correct or virtuous.
*An **honest** working stiff.*

honesty Southeastern European plant cultivated for its fragrant purplish flowers and round flat papery silver-white seedpods that are used for indoor decoration.
*They spoke with convincing **honesty** about their fears.*

ingenuous Characterized by an inability to mask your feelings; not devious.
*An **ingenuous** admission of responsibility.*

integrity	The condition of being unified or sound in construction. <i>Upholding territorial integrity and national sovereignty.</i>
naive	Of or created by one without formal training simple or naive in style. <i>Andy had a sweet naive look when he smiled.</i>
openness	(in sport) a style of play characterized by action which is spread out over the field. <i>Total openness to all points of view.</i>
outspoken	Given to expressing yourself freely or insistently. <i>He has been outspoken in his criticism.</i>
plain	Unmistakably plain is often used informally for plainly. <i>The main problem is just plain exhaustion.</i>
plainspoken	Characterized by directness in manner or speech; without subtlety or evasion. <i>Plainspoken and to the point.</i>
simple	Used to emphasize the fundamental and straightforward nature of something. <i>A simple design.</i>
simplicity	Absence of affectation or pretense. <i>The simplicity of a crystal.</i>
sincere	Open and genuine; not deceitful. <i>They offer their sincere thanks to Paul.</i>
sincerity	The quality of being open and truthful; not deceitful or hypocritical. <i>The sincerity of his beliefs is unquestionable.</i>
straightness	Freedom from crooks or curves or bends or angles.
transparency	Permitting the free passage of electromagnetic radiation. <i>The transparency of ice.</i>
transparent	Easy to perceive or detect. <i>The meaning of the poem is by no means transparent.</i>
truthfulness	The quality of being truthful. <i>We have had to judge the truthfulness of the evidence.</i>
veracity	Unwillingness to tell lies. <i>Voters should be concerned about his veracity and character.</i>
