gully A fielder at gully.


He was caught in the **gully** by Jones.

arid region, found chiefly in the south-western US.

They **gorge**d themselves on Cornish cream teas.

Low-lying wet land with grassy vegetation; usually is a transition zone between

marsh land and water.

Thousands of acres of **marsh**land.

mire Soil with mud muck or mire.

The mud **mire**d our cart.

An area of muddy or boggy ground.

She would become lost in a **morass** of lies and explanations.

precipice A very steep rock face or cliff, especially a tall one.

We swerved toward the edge of the **precipice**.

. A soft boggy area of land that gives way underfoot.

<u>quagmire</u> Torrential rain turned the building site into a **quagmire**.

ravine A deep narrow steep-sided valley (especially one formed by running water.
