## Associations of "Capitalizing" (30 Words)

<b>achieve</b>	Successfully bring about or reach (a desired objective or result) by effort, skill, or courage. <i>He <b>achieved</b> his ambition to become a press photographer.</i>
<b>acquisition</b>	The act of contracting or assuming or acquiring possession of something. <i>The company intends to grow within itself rather than by <b>acquisition</b>.</i>
<b>acronym</b>	A word formed from the initial letters of the several words in the name and pronounced as one word. <i>The word scuba is an <b>acronym</b> for s elf c ontained u nderwater b reathing a pparatus.</i>
<b>alphabet</b>	A set of letters or symbols in a fixed order used to represent the basic set of speech sounds of a language, especially the set of letters from A to Z. <i>DNA s 4 letter <b>alphabet</b>.</i>
<b>append</b>	Add (something) to the end of a written document. <i><b>Append</b> a charm to the necklace.</i>
<b>consonant</b>	Denoting or relating to a consonant. <i>A <b>consonant</b> phoneme.</i>
<b>derivation</b>	The act of deriving something or obtaining something from a source or origin. <i>He prefers shoes of Italian <b>derivation</b>.</i>
<b>derivative</b>	A substance that is derived chemically from a specified compound. <i>A <b>derivative</b> process.</i>
<b>dictionary</b>	A reference book containing an alphabetical list of words with information about them. <i>A <b>dictionary</b> of quotations.</i>
<b>diphthong</b>	A digraph representing the sound of a diphthong or single vowel as in feat.
<b>gain</b>	Win something through one’s efforts. <i>Shares <b>gained</b> for the third day in a row.</i>

<b>grammar</b>	A book on grammar. <i>My old Latin <b>grammar</b>.</i>
<b>honored</b>	Having an illustrious reputation; respected.
<b><u>indicative</u></b>	A verb in the indicative mood. <i>Having recurrent dreams is not necessarily <b>indicative</b> of any psychological problem.</i>
<b><u>invest</u></b>	Make an investment. <i>We have <b>invested</b> a considerable amount of time in demonstrating the value of the system.</i>
<b>letter</b>	An emblem in the shape of the initial letter of a school or university's name awarded to a student for achievement in sport. <i>Mailed an indignant <b>letter</b> to the editor.</i>
<b>noun</b>	A word other than a pronoun used to identify any of a class of people places or things common noun or to name a particular one of these proper noun.
<b>punctuation</b>	The use of certain marks to clarify meaning of written material by grouping words grammatically into sentences and clauses and phrases. <i>Satisfactory standards of handwriting spelling grammar and <b>punctuation</b>.</i>
<b>sentence</b>	Pronounce a sentence on somebody in a court of law. <i>He was under <b>sentence</b> of death.</i>
<b>success</b>	A person with a record of successes. <i>The president had some <b>success</b> in restoring confidence.</i>
<b><u>triumph</u></b>	Achieve a victory; be successful. <i>The king returned home in <b>triumph</b>.</i>
<b><u>triumphant</u></b>	Having won a battle or contest; victorious. <i>A comic fairy tale about innocence <b>triumphant</b>.</i>
<b>turnover</b>	A dish made by folding a piece of pastry over a filling. <i>A <b>turnover</b> approaching 4 million.</i>
<b>typographical</b>	Relating to or occurring or used in typography. <i><b>Typographical</b> symbols.</i>
<b>verb</b>	Use a word that is not conventionally used as a verb typically a noun as a verb. <i>Any English noun can be <b>verbed</b> but some are more resistant than others.</i>
<b><u>victory</u></b>	A successful ending of a struggle or contest. <i>A narrow <b>victory</b>.</i>
<b>vocabulary</b>	The system of techniques or symbols serving as a means of expression (as in arts or crafts). <i>The Sanskrit <b>vocabulary</b>.</i>

**vowel** A letter representing a vowel sound such as a e i o u.

**word** A word is a string of bits stored in computer memory.  
*He hardly said ten **words** all morning.*

**writing** The activity or skill of writing.  
*His **writing** looked crabbed.*
