boot	Kick give a boot to. <i>The laptop boots up in 14 seconds flat.</i>
bottle	A bottle fitted with a teat for giving milk or other drinks to babies and very young children. <i>One terrified contestant bottles it and scarpers.</i>
cape	In bullfighting taunt the bull by flourishing a cape. <i>He was wearing a flowing cape.</i>
cashmere	Woollen material made from or resembling cashmere. <i>A cashmere jumper.</i>
caulk	Seal with caulking. <i>Use silicone caulk to ensure that you have an all season moisture seal.</i>
ceiling	(meteorology) altitude of the lowest layer of clouds. <i>The aircraft s quoted ceiling of 24 000 feet.</i>
coat	Put a coat on cover the surface of furnish with a surface. <i>His coat pocket.</i>
cockade	A rosette or knot of ribbons worn in a hat as a badge of office, or as part of a livery. <i>The cap bore the traditional cockade in silver blue and red.</i>
cravat	A tie.
doff	Remove (an item of clothing). <i>The manager doffed his hat to her.</i>
fez	A felt cap (usually red) for a man; shaped like a flat-topped cone with a tassel that hangs from the crown.
glove	Of a wicketkeeper baseball catcher etc catch deflect or touch the ball with a gloved hand. <i>Rubber gloves.</i>

handkerchief	A square of cotton or other finely woven material intended for wiping one's nose.
hat	Headdress that protects the head from bad weather has shaped crown and usually a brim. <i>Wearing her scientific hat she is director of a pharmacology research group.</i>
headdress	An ornamental covering or band for the head, especially one worn on ceremonial occasions. <i>A veil held in place with a pearl headdress.</i>
jacket	The dust jacket of a book. <i>He put his hand in his jacket pocket.</i>
kerchief	A handkerchief.
lid	An eyelid. <i>A dustbin lid.</i>
millinery	Women's hats. <i>She is contemplating a new career in millinery.</i>
mitten	Glove that encases the thumb separately and the other four fingers together.
monocle	Lens for correcting defective vision in one eye; held in place by facial muscles.
raincoat	A water-resistant coat.
robe	Clothe in a robe or long loose outer garment. <i>The Chamberlain robed the king on coronation day.</i>
roof	Function as the roof of. <i>Fan vaults roof these magnificent buildings.</i>
scarf	Unite by a scarf joint. <i>A silk scarf.</i>
shirt	Put a shirt on. <i>A rugby shirt.</i>
skirt	A garment hanging from the waist; worn mainly by girls and women. <i>The treaty skirted around the question of political cooperation.</i>
sweater	A person who perspires. <i>A close knit wool sweater for icy weather.</i>
umbrella	The gelatinous disc of a jellyfish, which it contracts and expands to move through the water. <i>An air umbrella over England.</i>
