canny	Having or showing shrewdness and good judgement, especially in money or business matters. Canny investors will switch banks if they think they are getting a raw deal.




<u>cautious</u>	(of a person) careful to avoid potential problems or dangers. Firms have been unusually cautious about hiring new workers.
<u>chary</u>	Cautiously or suspiciously reluctant to do something. A chary investor.
circumspect	Wary and unwilling to take risks. Physicians are now more circumspect about recommending its use.
conscientious	Relating to a person's conscience. The individual is denied even the opportunity to break the law on conscientious grounds.
<u>deliberate</u>	Carefully thought out in advance. With all deliberate speed.
diligent	Quietly and steadily persevering especially in detail or exactness. A diligent detective investigates all clues.
economic	Of or relating to the science of economics. A modern economic al heating system.
economical	Giving good value or return in relation to the money, time, or effort expended. An <i>economical</i> meal.
<u>fastidious</u>	Very concerned about matters of cleanliness. The child seemed fastidious about getting her fingers dirty.
frugal	Avoiding waste. A frugal farmer.
<u>guarded</u>	Cautious and having possible reservations. <i>Guarded</i> optimism.
heedful	Cautiously attentive. <i>Heedful</i> of his father s advice.
judicious	Having, showing, or done with good judgement or sense. <i>Judicious</i> use of one s money.
measured	Unhurried and with care and dignity. <i>His measured prose.</i>
<u>methodical</u>	Characterized by method and orderliness. A methodical man he assembled all the papers into a huge pile.
<u>meticulous</u>	Marked by precise accordance with details. <i>He had always been so meticulous about his appearance.</i>
<u>mindful</u>	Conscious or aware of something. <i>Tune in to your body and be mindful.</i>



orderly	(of a person or group) well behaved. An orderly arrangement of objects.
<u>painstaking</u>	Done with or employing great care and thoroughness. <i>Painstaking</i> attention to detail.
perfectionist	Refusing to accept any standard short of perfection.
<u>protective</u>	Relating to the protection of domestic industries from foreign competition. <i>I felt protective towards her.</i>
<u>prudent</u>	Acting with or showing care and thought for the future. <i>Prudent</i> rulers.
punctilious	Marked by precise accordance with details. <i>Punctilious</i> in his attention to rules of etiquette.
scrupulous	Having scruples; arising from a sense of right and wrong; principled. <i>Scrupulous</i> attention to details.
sedulous	Marked by care and persistent effort. Sedulous pursuit of legal and moral principles.
sensible	Readily perceived; appreciable. Sensible that a good deal more is still to be done.
sparing	Moderate; economical. Sparing in their use of heat and light.
<u>thrifty</u>	Careful and diligent in the use of resources. <i>He had been brought up to be thrifty and careful.</i>
vigilant	Keeping careful watch for possible danger or difficulties. The vigilant eye of the town watch.
wary	Openly distrustful and unwilling to confide. <i>Taught to be wary of strangers.</i>
watchful	Wakeful; sleepless. They attended dances under the watchful eye of their father.

alert	A warning serves to make you more alert to danger. An alert mind.
<u>attentive</u>	Paying close attention to something. <i>Attentive</i> to details.
<u>beware</u>	Be on one's guard; be cautious or wary about; be alert to. <i>We should beware the incompetence of legislators.</i>
carefully	Taking care or paying attention. They must be carefully handled and stored.
carefulness	The quality of being careful and painstaking. I admired the carefulness of his work.
caution	An amusing or surprising person. They let him off with a caution .
<u>cautious</u>	People who are fearful and cautious. <i>Reserved and cautious never making swift decisions.</i>
<u>chary</u>	Characterized by great caution and wariness. <i>Chary of the risks involved.</i>



circumspect	Wary and unwilling to take risks. The officials were very circumspect in their statements.
circumspection	The quality of being wary and unwilling to take risks; prudence. <i>Circumspection</i> is required in the day to day exercise of administrative powers.
conscientious	Characterized by extreme care and great effort. The individual is denied even the opportunity to break the law on conscientious grounds.
<u>deliberate</u>	Consider (a question) carefully. A deliberate attempt to provoke conflict.
<u>deliberation</u>	Slow and careful movement or thought. <i>He was a man of judicial deliberation.</i>
<u>discernment</u>	Delicate discrimination (especially of aesthetic values. An astonishing lack of discernment .
<u>discreetly</u>	With discretion; prudently and with wise self-restraint. <i>He</i> discreetly <i>inquired whether the position was still available</i> .
<u>discretion</u>	The freedom to decide what should be done in a particular situation. Honorary fellowships may be awarded at the discretion of the council.
forethought	Careful consideration of what will be necessary or may happen in the future. Jim had the forethought to book in advance.
heed	Pay close attention to give heed to. <i>He should have heeded the warnings.</i>
measured	Unhurried and with care and dignity. <i>His measured prose.</i>
<u>meticulous</u>	Showing great attention to detail; very careful and precise. The designs are hand glazed with meticulous care.
modesty	Freedom from vanity or conceit. With typical modesty he insisted on sharing the credit with others.
<u>muse</u>	(in Greek and Roman mythology) each of nine goddesses, the daughters of Zeus and Mnemosyne, who preside over the arts and sciences. <i>Yeats</i> muse <i>Maud Gonne</i> .
precaution	A precautionary measure warding off impending danger or damage or injury etc. <i>We never took precautions.</i>
<u>precision</u>	Marked by or adapted for accuracy and exactness. A technique which examines and identifies each character with the highest level of precision .



prudence	Discretion in practical affairs. We need to exercise prudence in such important matters.
scrupulous	Characterized by extreme care and great effort. She s too scrupulous to have an affair with a married man.
solicitous	Full of anxiety and concern. <i>Solicitous</i> parents.
thoughtful	Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention. <i>Her work is thoughtful and provocative.</i>
wary	Marked by keen caution and watchful prudence. A wary glance at the black clouds.
watchful	Watching someone or something closely; alert and vigilant. They attended dances under the watchful eye of their father.
