<u>chary</u>	Cautiously or suspiciously reluctant to do something. <i>A chary investor.</i>
circumspect	Wary and unwilling to take risks. <i>Physicians are now more circumspect about recommending its use.</i>
conscientious	Relating to a person's conscience. <i>The individual is denied even the opportunity to break the law on conscientious grounds.</i>
<u>deliberate</u>	Carefully thought out in advance. <i>With all deliberate speed.</i>
diligent	Quietly and steadily persevering especially in detail or exactness. <i>A diligent detective investigates all clues.</i>
economic	Of or relating to the science of economics. <i>A modern economical heating system.</i>
economical	Giving good value or return in relation to the money, time, or effort expended. <i>An economical meal.</i>
<u>fastidious</u>	Very concerned about matters of cleanliness. <i>The child seemed fastidious about getting her fingers dirty.</i>
frugal	Avoiding waste. <i>A frugal farmer.</i>
<u>guarded</u>	Cautious and having possible reservations. <i>Guarded optimism.</i>
heedful	Cautiously attentive. <i>Heedful of his father s advice.</i>
judicious	Having, showing, or done with good judgement or sense. <i>Judicious use of one s money.</i>
measured	Unhurried and with care and dignity. <i>His measured prose.</i>
<u>methodical</u>	Characterized by method and orderliness. <i>A methodical man he assembled all the papers into a huge pile.</i>
<u>meticulous</u>	Marked by precise accordance with details. <i>He had always been so meticulous about his appearance.</i>
<u>mindful</u>	Conscious or aware of something. <i>Tune in to your body and be mindful.</i>

orderly	(of a person or group) well behaved. <i>An orderly arrangement of objects.</i>
<u>painstaking</u>	Done with or employing great care and thoroughness. <i>Painstaking attention to detail.</i>
perfectionist	Refusing to accept any standard short of perfection.
<u>protective</u>	Relating to the protection of domestic industries from foreign competition. <i>I felt protective towards her.</i>
<u>prudent</u>	Acting with or showing care and thought for the future. <i>Prudent rulers.</i>
punctilious	Marked by precise accordance with details. <i>Punctilious in his attention to rules of etiquette.</i>
scrupulous	Having scruples; arising from a sense of right and wrong; principled. <i>Scrupulous attention to details.</i>
sedulous	Marked by care and persistent effort. <i>Sedulous pursuit of legal and moral principles.</i>
sensible	Readily perceived; appreciable. <i>Sensible that a good deal more is still to be done.</i>
sparing	Moderate; economical. <i>Sparing in their use of heat and light.</i>
<u>thrifty</u>	Careful and diligent in the use of resources. <i>He had been brought up to be thrifty and careful.</i>
vigilant	Keeping careful watch for possible danger or difficulties. <i>The vigilant eye of the town watch.</i>
wary	Openly distrustful and unwilling to confide. <i>Taught to be wary of strangers.</i>
watchful	Wakeful; sleepless. <i>They attended dances under the watchful eye of their father.</i>

carefully	Taking care or paying attention. <i>They must be carefully handled and stored.</i>
carefulness	The quality of being careful and painstaking. <i>I admired the carefulness of his work.</i>
caution	An amusing or surprising person. <i>They let him off with a caution.</i>

conscientious	Characterized by extreme care and great effort. <i>The individual is denied even the opportunity to break the law on conscientious grounds.</i>
deliberate	Consider (a question) carefully. <i>A deliberate attempt to provoke conflict.</i>
deliberation	Slow and careful movement or thought. <i>He was a man of judicial deliberation.</i>
discernment	Delicate discrimination (especially of aesthetic values). <i>An astonishing lack of discernment.</i>
discreetly	With discretion; prudently and with wise self-restraint. <i>He discreetly inquired whether the position was still available.</i>
discretion	The freedom to decide what should be done in a particular situation. <i>Honorary fellowships may be awarded at the discretion of the council.</i>
forethought	Careful consideration of what will be necessary or may happen in the future. <i>Jim had the forethought to book in advance.</i>
heed	Pay close attention to give heed to. <i>He should have heeded the warnings.</i>
measured	Unhurried and with care and dignity. <i>His measured prose.</i>
meticulous	Showing great attention to detail; very careful and precise. <i>The designs are hand glazed with meticulous care.</i>
modesty	Freedom from vanity or conceit. <i>With typical modesty he insisted on sharing the credit with others.</i>
muse	(in Greek and Roman mythology) each of nine goddesses, the daughters of Zeus and Mnemosyne, who preside over the arts and sciences. <i>Yeats muse Maud Gonne.</i>
precaution	A precautionary measure warding off impending danger or damage or injury etc. <i>We never took precautions.</i>
precision	Marked by or adapted for accuracy and exactness. <i>A technique which examines and identifies each character with the highest level of precision.</i>

prudence	Discretion in practical affairs. <i>We need to exercise prudence in such important matters.</i>
scrupulous	Characterized by extreme care and great effort. <i>She s too scrupulous to have an affair with a married man.</i>
solicitous	Full of anxiety and concern. <i>Solicitous parents.</i>
thoughtful	Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention. <i>Her work is thoughtful and provocative.</i>
wary	Marked by keen caution and watchful prudence. <i>A wary glance at the black clouds.</i>
watchful	Watching someone or something closely; alert and vigilant. <i>They attended dances under the watchful eye of their father.</i>
