- *A person who is responsible for attending to the needs of a child or dependent adult.*

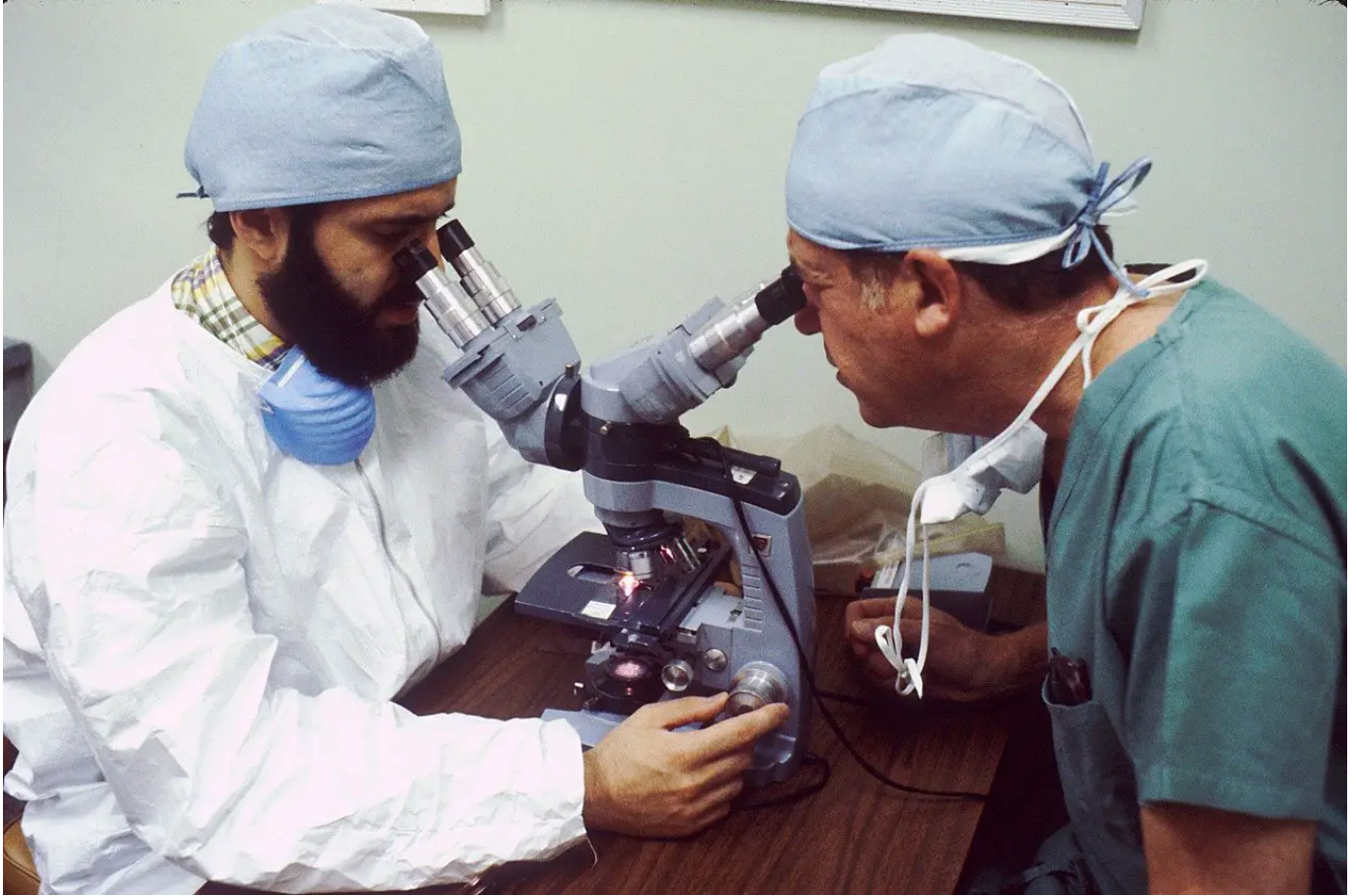


### **Synonyms of "Caregiver" as a noun (4 Words)**

<b>grandfather</b>	The father of your father or mother. <i>Freud is often called the <b>grandfather</b> of psychoanalysis.</i>
<b>grandma</b>	One's grandmother. <b>Grandma</b> Wendy.
<b>grandmother</b>	The mother of your father or mother. <i>My <b>grandmother</b> is ill.</i>
<b>grandpa</b>	The father of your father or mother.
<b>grandparent</b>	A parent of your father or mother. <i>It must be a great blessing to have Chloe's <b>grandparents</b> living nearby.</i>
<b>homemaker</b>	A wife who manages a household while her husband earns the family income.
<b>maternal</b>	Related through the mother's side of the family. <i>My <b>maternal</b> grandmother.</i>
<b>matriarch</b>	A female head of a family or tribe. <i>A domineering <b>matriarch</b>.</i>
<b>matriarchy</b>	The state of being an older, powerful woman in a family or group. <i>A <b>matriarchy</b> run by morally superior women.</i>
<b>mom</b>	Informal terms for a mother. <i>My <b>mom</b> gave us each a slice of pizza.</i>
<b>mommy</b>	One's mother (chiefly as a child's term).
<b>mother</b>	A term of address for a mother superior. <i>A <b>mother</b> of three.</i>
<b>nan</b>	The mother of your father or mother.
<b>parent</b>	Be or act as a parent to a child. <i>God's hand had written in the hearts of our first <b>parents</b> all the rules of good.</i>
<b>parental</b>	Designating the generation of organisms from which hybrid offspring are produced. <i>I may revisit this diner if the <b>parentals</b> are in town.</i>
<b>paternal</b>	Relating to or characteristic of or befitting a parent. <i>My elders in the newsroom kept a <b>paternal</b> eye on me.</i>
<b>paternity</b>	(especially in legal contexts) the state of being someone's father. <i>He refused to admit <b>paternity</b> of the child.</i>
<b>patriarchy</b>	A society or community organized on patriarchal lines. <i>We live in a <b>patriarchy</b>.</i>

**progeny** A descendant or the descendants of a person, animal, or plant; offspring.  
*Shorthorn cattle are highly effective in bestowing their characteristics on their **progeny**.*

**sister** A title given to a nun (and used as a form of address).  
*I had nine brothers and **sisters**.*

**sisterhood** The relationship between sisters.  
*Canadian feminists acknowledge their **sisterhood** with women around the globe.*

**widower** A man whose spouse is often away participating in a specified sport or activity.  
*Her new found passion has turned me into a tennis **widower**.*
