- Not concerned or worried about.
- Effortless and unstudied.
- Marked by lack of attention or consideration or forethought or thoroughness; not careful.
- Marked by lack of attention or consideration or forethought or thoroughness; not careful.



- (usually followed by `of') without due thought or consideration.
- Not giving sufficient attention or thought to avoiding harm or errors.

indiscreet Lacking discretion; injudicious.

informal Having or fostering a warm or friendly and informal atmosphere.

An **informal** free and easy manner.

insensitive Not responsive to physical stimuli.

Insensitive to radiation.

insouciant Marked by blithe unconcern.

An utterly **insouciant** financial policy.

(of a person, manner, or gesture) having or showing a disinclination

languid for physical exertion or effort.

A **languid** mood.

Of a speech sound especially a vowel pronounced with the vocal
