## Associations of "Caressed" (30 Words)

<b>adore</b>	Love and respect (someone) deeply. <i>She <b>adores</b> Mexican cuisine.</i>
<b>affection</b>	A positive feeling of liking. <i>An <b>affection</b> of the skin.</i>
<b>beating</b>	Pulsation or throbbing, especially of the heart. <i>Torture methods included <b>beating</b>.</i>
<b>cherish</b>	Be fond of; be attached to. <i>I <b>cherish</b> the letters she wrote.</i>
<b>congratulatory</b>	Conveying good wishes or praise to someone in response to an achievement or special occasion. <i>As well as a <b>congratulatory</b> message from the Queen Elsie received many cards and flowers.</i>
<b>couple</b>	A pair of partners in a dance or game. <i>We got some eggs would you like a <b>couple</b>.</i>
<b>cuddly</b>	Denoting a toy, especially a model of an animal, that is padded or spongy and covered in soft fabric. <i>She was short and <b>cuddly</b>.</i>
<b>diagonal</b>	Mathematics a set of entries in a square matrix running diagonally either from the upper left to lower right entry or running from the upper right to lower left entry. <i>A <b>diagonal</b> line across the page.</i>
<b>embrace</b>	Hold (someone) closely in one’s arms, especially as a sign of affection. <i>Aunt Sophie <b>embraced</b> her warmly.</i>
<b>embracement</b>	The act of clasping another person in the arms (as in greeting or affection).
<b>encourage</b>	Contribute to the progress or growth of. <i>Pupils are <b>encouraged</b> to be creative.</i>
<b>espouse</b>	Take in marriage. <i>A virgin <b>espoused</b> to a man whose name was Joseph.</i>

<b>family</b>	An association of people who share common beliefs or activities. <i>The <b>family</b> home.</i>
<b>fondly</b>	With affection or liking. <i>They <b>fondly</b> believed the cheers were for them.</i>
<b>greeting</b>	(usually plural) an acknowledgment or expression of good will (especially on meeting). <i>Mandy shouted a <b>greeting</b>.</i>
<b>hit</b>	Hit the intended target or goal. <i>He picked up the phone and <b>hit</b> several buttons.</i>
<b>hug</b>	Cherish or cling to (something such as a belief). <i>Left winger Stewart <b>hugged</b> the touchline.</i>
<b>kiss</b>	A light glancing touch. <i>A quick <b>kiss</b> on the cheek.</i>
<b>kissing</b>	Affectionate play (or foreplay without contact with the genital organs).
<b>love</b>	A personified figure of love often represented as Cupid. <i>I just <b>love</b> dancing.</i>
<b>lovingly</b>	With love or great care. <i>They smile <b>lovingly</b> at each other.</i>
<b>married</b>	Married people. <i><b>Married</b> life.</i>
<b>pat</b>	Pat or squeeze fondly or playfully especially under the chin. <i>A <b>pat</b> reply.</i>
<b>snugly</b>	With comparative ease; comfortably. <i>He motored away to win <b>snugly</b> by three and a half lengths.</i>
<b>soothe</b>	Cause to feel better. <i>The medicine <b>soothes</b> the pain of the inflammation.</i>
<b>tap</b>	Walk with a tapping sound. <i>On most vices the metal jaws are drilled and <b>tapped</b> to accept screws.</i>
<b>whisper</b>	A soft or confidential tone of voice a whispered word or phrase. <i>Alison was <b>whispering</b> in his ear.</i>
