congratulatory	Conveying good wishes or praise to someone in response to an achievement or special occasion. As well as a congratulatory message from the Queen Elsie received many cards and flowers.
<u>couple</u>	A pair of partners in a dance or game. We got some eggs would you like a couple .
cuddly	Denoting a toy, especially a model of an animal, that is padded or spongy and covered in soft fabric. <i>She was short and cuddly.</i>
diagonal	Mathematics a set of entries in a square matrix running diagonally either from the upper left to lower right entry or running from the upper right to lower left entry. A diagonal line across the page.
embrace	Hold (someone) closely in one's arms, especially as a sign of affection. <i>Aunt Sophie embraced her warmly.</i>
embracement	The act of clasping another person in the arms (as in greeting or affection.
encourage	Contribute to the progress or growth of. <i>Pupils are encouraged to be creative</i> .
<u>espouse</u>	Take in marriage. A virgin espouse d to a man whose name was Joseph.



family	An association of people who share common beliefs or activities. <i>The family home.</i>
<u>fondly</u>	With affection or liking. They fondly believed the cheers were for them.
greeting	(usually plural) an acknowledgment or expression of good will (especially on meeting. <i>Mandy shouted a greeting</i> .
hit	Hit the intended target or goal. <i>He picked up the phone and hit several buttons.</i>
<u>hug</u>	Cherish or cling to (something such as a belief. Left winger Stewart hug ged the touchline.
kiss	A light glancing touch. A quick kiss on the cheek.
kissing	Affectionate play (or foreplay without contact with the genital organs.
love	A personified figure of love often represented as Cupid. <i>I just love dancing.</i>
<u>lovingly</u>	With love or great care. They smile lovingly at each other.
married	Married people. <i>Married</i> life.
pat	Pat or squeeze fondly or playfully especially under the chin. A pat reply.
snugly	With comparative ease; comfortably. He motored away to win snugly by three and a half lengths.
soothe	Cause to feel better. The medicine soothe s the pain of the inflammation.
tap	Walk with a tapping sound. On most vices the metal jaws are drilled and tap ped to accept screws.
<u>whisper</u>	A soft or confidential tone of voice a whispered word or phrase. <i>Alison was whispering in his ear.</i>
